I. **MOTION TO STRIKE**

Now comes, JMI Edison ("JMI"), Appellant and moves to strike a portion of the General Services Agency's ("GSA") Memorandum on Remedies specifically, Section I of the brief beginning on page 1 and ending on page 3. This portion of the brief should not be part of the record on this Appeal.

On March 3, 2011, the Office of the Public Auditor ("OPA") through Administrative Hearing Officer Anthony Camacho, ordered that the parties to the instant bid protest appeal may submit additional briefing to the OPA on the limited issue of remedies. The OPA's written Order was clear, and mirrored its oral edict regarding the same. 1/2 Specifically, the OPA Order After Pre-Hearing Conference ("Order") stated that "additional briefs on the issue of Remedies..." could be submitted. See Order at P.2 ¶ 3 L.16-18, filed on March 3, 2011.

At the Prehearing Conference Appellant consented to the allowance of additional briefing on the limited issue of remedies, but preserved on the record its objection to any briefing that sought to address the merits of the Appeal beyond those timely submissions allowed by the Procurement Code and

On Tuesday March 8, 2011, Appellant JMI Edison submitted its statement regarding remedies. The General Services Agency ("GSA"), represented by the Office of the Attorney General, submitted a "Memorandum on Remedies." It's a four and a half (4½) page memorandum containing a two (2) page discussion on appropriate remedies, and a lengthier attempt to provide argument regarding the merits of Appellant's Appeal. In effect, the Government has placed before the OPA a further round of argument and briefing that was not contemplated by the Procurement Code, leaving Appellant with no procedural method through which to respond, and violates the explicit commands of the Hearing Officer in this matter.

Appellant JMI Edison submits the instant objection to those portions of the Government's memorandum that violates the OPA Order of March 3, 2011, and requests that the office of the OPA strike from the record the portion of the brief from Section I, page 1-3.
