

PREVENTIVE MAINTENANCE AND REPAIRS OF CENTRAL AIR-CONDITIONING EQUIPMENT FOR ALL GDOE PUBLIC SCHOOLS AND SUPPORT FACILITIES

1. GENERAL SPECIFICATIONS:

This contract contains the general and detailed specifications for preventive maintenance, minor and major repairs, installations, relocation and replacement of central air-conditioning equipment located all GDOE Public Schools and Support Facilities within the GDOE, hereinafter referred to as the "Department".

Bidder shall provide labor cost requirements for:

- a. Preventive Maintenance of Air-Conditioning Equipment;
- b. Minor repairs of Air-Conditioning Equipment; and
- c. Major Repairs, Installation, Relocation and Replacement of Central Air-Conditioning Equipment.

2. CONTRACTOR QUALIFICATIONS:

The Contractor shall be a qualified contractor licensed to do business on Guam and be able to perform the type of work under this contract. The Contractor shall have adequate facilities, labor, equipment and parts to perform the required maintenance and repair work under this contract on an on-call and/or scheduled basis. Contractor should have adequate number of employees on payroll with minimum experience of not less than five (5) years per employee or any combination of equivalence of the above deemed acceptable to the Department. The Contractor shall be capable to respond to work request made by the Department and shall have adequate communication capability to be contacted between the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. daily, seven (7) days a week.

3. SCOPE OF WORK:

A. Preventive Maintenance:

Assirtionally, because lob titles vary yidely and change quickly in the computer embatry, lob rivies are not determinative of the application of the computer professional exemption. Therefore, the exemption applies only to computer employees who satisfy the compensation requirements and whose primary duty consists of:

(1) The application of systems analysis techniques and procedures, including consulting with users, to determine hardware, software or system functional

(2) The design, development, documentation, analysis, creation, testing or modification of computer systems or programs, including prototypes, based on and related to user or system design specifications;

(3) The design, documentation, testing, creation or modification of computer programs related to machine operating systems; or

(4) A combination of the aforementioned duties, the performance of which requires the same level of skills. (29 C.F.R. 541.400).

2) AIR TRAFFIC CONTROLLERS AND WEATHER OBSERVERS - NIGHT PAY & SUNDAY PAY: If you work at night as part of a regular tour of duty, you will earn a night differential and receive an additional 10% of basic pay for any hours worked between 6pm and 6am. Conformance Process:

The contracting officer shall require that any class of service employee which is not listed herein and which is to be employed under the contract (i.e., the work to be performed is not performed by any classification listed in the wage determination), be classified by the contractor so as to provide a reasonable relationship (i.e., appropriate level of skill comparison) between such unlisted classifications and the classifications listed in the wage determination. Such conformed classes of employees shall be paid the monetary wages and furnished the fringe benefits as are determined. Such conforming process shall be initiated by of employees. The conformed classification, wage rate, and/or fringe benefits shall be retroactive to the commencement date of the contract. (See Section 4.6 (C)(vi)) when multiple wage determinations are included in a contract, a separate SF 1444 should be prepared for each wage determination to which a class(es) is to be

The process for preparing a conformance request is as follows:

- 1) When preparing the bid, the contractor identifies the need for a conformed occupation(s) and computes a proposed rate(s).
- 2) After contract award, the contractor prepares a written report listing in order proposed classification title(s), a Federal grade equivalency (FGE) for each proposed classification(s), job description(s), and rationale for proposed wage rate(s), including information regarding the agreement or disagreement of the authorized representative of the employees involved, or where there is no authorized representative, the employees themselves. This report should be submitted to the contracting officer no later than 30 days after such unlisted class(es) of employees performs any contract work.
- 3) The contracting officer reviews the proposed action and promptly submits a report of the action, together with the agency's recommendations and pertinent information including the position of the contractor and the employees, to the Wage and Hour Division, Employment Standards Administration, U.S. Department of Labor, for review. When preparing a conformance request, the "Service Contract Act Directory of Gosupations" (the Directory) should be used to compare job definitions to insure that duties requested are not performed by a classification already listed in the wage determination. Remember, it is not the job title, but the required tasks that determine whether a class is included in an established wage determination. Conformances may not be used to artificially split, combine, or subdivide classifications listed in the wage determination.
