RE: Denied Contract for Services in Violation of GCA 5001 (d)

Ms. Brooks,

According to GARR 12103 (a) The Public Auditor shall have the power to review and determine de novo any matter properly submitted to her or him. Towards that section, Able Industries of the Pacific (AIP) is requesting the assistance of your office in appealing the award of the custodial services contact to multiple bidders in violation of GCA 5001(d).

Statement of Facts:

On March 18, 2013, I personally met with Charles Ada, Executive Manager of the Guam International Airport Authority (GIAA) and hand delivered a letter (ATTACHMENT!) to inform him that AIP was requesting to be awarded the terminal contract for custodial services (GIAA IFB NO. GIAA-001-FY13) under GCA 3110.1 Procurement from Nonprofit Corporations which states that: "A contract may be awarded for a supply or service without going through the competitive scaled bid procedure with the contractor is a non-profit corporation."

The intent is further made clear and unambiguous in **GCA 5001(d)** which reads as follows:

"Policy Concerning Sheltered Workers or Persons with Disabilities. If any entity of the government of Guam or any entity expending governmental funds intends to procure any supply or service which is offered by a nonprofit corporation employing sheltered workers or persons with disabilities, or a government of Guam entity employing sheltered workers or persons with disabilities, then that entity shall procure such supply or service from that

nonprofit corporation or government entity *if* the supply or service is available within the period required by the procuring entity."

He informed me that he was going to have the legal counsel for GIAA review the document and related law before he could address our request.

On March 29, 2013, AIP was informed by letter sent the day of; and received after the bid opening that GIAA was going to proceed with the bid process. (ATTACHMENT B)

While waiting for a response from GIAA, AIP submitted a bid for the custodial service contract, and was notified by fax (ATTACHMENT C) our company was disqualified from consideration for contract award due to lack of a bid bond in direct violation of GCA 3110.1 which states: "Furthermore, the supply or service must be available within the period required by the procurement authority. Contractor awarded a contract pursuant to this Section shall not be required to post any of the bonds required under Sections 3310D(e) (:~) and 3109(c)(4)."

On May 23, 2013, I submitted a request to Charles Ada, requesting clarification on the policy for awarding contracts to nonprofits (ATTACHMENT D).

On May 28, 2013, I submitted an appeal to the contract award, and an appeal to reverse our disqualification. On that same day, I met with executives from GIAA to discuss why AIP was not awarded the contract in light of GCA 3110.1 and was provided with no regulation or legal based response. Also on May 23rd, I submitted a written request to the Frank Taitano, Supply Procurement Manager, that GIAA provide the legal justification for not awarding this contract. (ATTACHMENT E).

In denying our bid, GIAA did not cite legal justification for not awarding this contract to Able Industries of the Pacific under the requirements of GCA 5001(d) and we believe this is a violation of the Government of Guam Procurement Laws.

On June 4, 2013, I received a letter from GSA (ATTACHMENT F) stating that the GIAA was NOT required to consider awarding the contract to nonprofits under GARR 3110.1, but did not address the issue of GCA 5001 (d).

On June 6, 2013, I met with Patrick Kono of the GSA to discuss the bid situation at the airport in response to our company's protest to contract award and disqualification. I was informed verbally by Patrick Kono that the GIAA did not receive a protest from Able. I showed him a copy of the protest, and he informed that the GIAA's position is

since I did not use the word "PROTEST" in the subject matter of our submission; the airport did not consider the submission a protest.

At that same meeting, I requested clarification on GCA 5001 (d) from GSA (ATTACHMENT F) and was informed by Mr. Kono, that GIAA was correct in rejecting our request for consideration under GARR 3110.1 saying that the GARR overrides the GCA. I do not believe that the rules override the law.

On June 6, 2013, I received a letter from Charles Ada GIAA Executive Manager that denied our appeal and provided no citation for justification to not comply with GCA 5001 (d). (ATTACHMENT G)

I am requesting that your office put award of the contract on hold until such time as the provisions of GCA 5001 (d) have been clarified by appropriate reviewing legal authority.



If the parties do not agree as to the disclosure of data, the Procurement Officer shall inform the bidder in writing what portions of the unpriced technical offer will be disclosed and that unless the bidder protests under Chapter 9 (Legal and Contractual Remedies) of the Guam Procurement Regulations, the offer will be so disclosed. Such technical offer shall be opened to public inspection subject to any continuing prohibition on the disclosure of confidential data; and

(d) unpriced technical offers of bidders who are not awarded the contract shall not be opened to public inspection unless the Procurement Officer determines in writing that public inspection of such offers is essential to assure confidence in the integrity of the procurement process; provided, however, that the provisions of Subsection 3109(v)(2)(c) of this Section shall apply with respect to the possible disclosure of trade secrets and proprietary data.

§3110.1 Procurement from Nonprofit Corporations. A contract may be awarded for a supply or service without going through the competitive sealed bid procedure when the contractor is a non-profit corporation employing sheltered or disabled workers.

As a condition of the award of the contract the contractor must certify that labor on the project will be performed by disabled persons except that supervisory personnel do not have to be disabled. Furthermore, the supply or service must be available within the period required by the procurement: authority, contractor awarded a contract pursuant to this Section shall not be required to post any of the bonds required under Sections 33109(c)(3) and 3109(c)(4).

According to GARR 12103 (a) The Public Auditor shall have the power to review and determine de novo any matter properly submitted to her or him. Towards that section, Able Industries of the Pacific (AIP) is requesting the assistance of your office in appealing the award of the custodial services contract to multiple bidders in violation of GCA 3110.1.

Statement of Facts

On March 18, 2013, I personally met with Charles Ada, Executive Manager of the Guam International Airport Authority (GIAA) and informed me that AIP was requesting to be awarded the terminal contract for custodial services (GIAA IFB NO. GIAA-001-FY13) under GCA 3110.1 Procurement from Nonprofit Corporations. "A contract may be awarded for a supply or service without going through the competitive scaled bid procedure when the contractor is a non-profit corporation."

The intent is made clear and unambiguous in **GCA 5001(d)** (ATTACHMENT A) which reads as follows:

"Policy Concerning Sheltered Workers or Persons with Disabilities. If any entity of the government of Guam or any entity expending governmental funds intends to procure any supply or service which is offered by a nonprofit corporation employing sheltered workers or persons with disabilities, or a government of Guam entity employing sheltered workers or persons with disabilities, then that entity shall procure such supply or service from that nonprofit corporation or government entity if the supply or service is available within the period required by the procuring entity."

He informed me that he was going to have the legal counsel for GIAA review the document and related law before he could address our request.

On March 29, 2013, AIP was informed by letter sent the day of; and received after the bid opening that GIAA was going to proceed with the bid process. (ATTACHMENT B)

While waiting for a response from GIAA, AIP submitted a bid for the custodial service contract, and was notified by fax (ATTACHMENT C) our company was disqualified from consideration for contract award due to lack of a bid bond in direct violation of GCA 3110.1 which states: "Furthermore, the supply or service must be available within the period required by the procurement authority. Contractor awarded a contract pursuant to this Section shall not be required to post any of the bonds required under Sections 3310D(e) (:~) and 3109(c)(4)."

On May 20th I met with executives from GIAA to discuss why AIP was not awarded the contract in light of GCA 3110.1 and was provided with no regulation or legal based response. On May 23rd, I submitted a written request that GIAA provide the legal justification for not awarding this contract. (ATTACHMENT D). In denying our bid, GIAA did not cite legal justification for not awarding this contract to Able Industries of the Pacific under the requirements of GCA 3110.1(d) and we believe this is a violation of the Government of Guam Procurement Laws.

I am in receipt of your memorandum dated June 3, 2013, in which you requested a clarification of the government of Guam policy on procurement from companies employing disabled or sheltered individuals. This is not a new issue. Please see attached an opinion from the Attorney General's office written in 1987. The law has not changed since the opinion was written.

However, notwithstanding the opinion, the General Services Agency has enacted a twoprong opportunity for those companies that employ shelter or handicapped individuals that wish to compete for government contracts. The first, is if a government entity wishes to put out for bid a procurement in which a company who employs sheltered or handicapped individuals may be qualified to do the work, the agency will contact all of the companies that may be qualified to submit a bid. If the bid is within the certified amount, then the agency will offer the contract to them. If the bids do not come within the certified amount, then these bids will be rejected and those companies may compete in the regular bid.

However, please note that the Chief Procurement Officer, in this case, the General Manager of the Guam International Airport Authority, has been given delegation to make such a decision in his discretion.

We are in receipt of your memorandum dated March 23, 1987 in which you requested the following:

REOUEST:

Does Public Law 18-15:25 [§6959.7 of the Government Code] require that a contractor which is a nonprofit corporation employing sheltered or handicapped workers capable of providing the needed supply or services be awarded the contract without competitive bidding?

ANSWER: No.

STATEMENT OF FACTS:

Section 25 of Public Law 18-15 which is \$6959.7 of the Government Code, provides that a contract may be awarded for supply or service without competition when the contractor is a nonprofit corporation employing sheltered or handicapped workers. General Services Agency is inquiring whether such contracts must be awarded to these contractors.

DISCUSSION:

Under P.L. 16-124, the Chief Procurement Officer is given certain discretionary powers. Section 6954.3 (c)(i) of the Government Code states:

(c) Duties. (1) Except as otherwise specifically provided in this Title, the Chief Procurement Officer shall, in accordance with regulations promulgated by the Policy Office:

(i) procure or supervise the procurement of all supplies and services needed by the Territory.

to Chief Procurement Officer, GSA sch 30, 1987 age 2

Section 6959.7 of the Government Code, enacted by P.L. 18-15:25, states:

§6959.7. Procurement from Non-Profit Corporations. A contract may be awarded for a supply or service without competition when the contract is a nonprofit corporation employing sheltered or handicapped workers. As a condition of the award of the contract the contractor must certify that labor on the project will be performed by handicapped persons except that supervisory personnel do not have to be handicapped. A contractor awarded a contract pursuant to this Section shall not be required to post any of the bonds required under Chapter 5 of this Title. (Emphasis added)

The law is clear and unambiguous. The Chief Procurement Officer, in his discretion, may award such a contract for supply or service without competition if all of the criteria of this section are met. The law is permissive, not mandatory, clearly giving the Chief Procurement Officer the discretion to determine whether so awarding a particular contract is in the best interest of the territory, keeping in mind the obvious intent of the legislative to encourage government contracts that benefit sheltered or handicapped workers. Notwithstanding P.L. 18-8:8, the later enactment is controlling with respect to this particular type of contract.
