The Bureau of Information Technology (BIT) refutes any allegation that the entire procurement record has not been submitted to the Office of Public Accountability. The only records that were not submitted were the other proposals that were deemed non-responsive by BIT. Appellant was found to be the only responsive vendor submitting a proposal.

Appellant opens their comment by making an allegation that they "filed with the OPA a Notice and Request setting forth certain information missing from the procurement record submitted by the agency..." BIT nor the Office of the Attorney General were served with such request. A search on the OPA's web page has no indication that such a document has been



filed. Furthermore, despite Appellant's allegation of files being withheld BIT represents that all files regarding RFP-OOG-023 has been submitted to the OPA.

Currently email range from no charge to \$33.00 per user per year. Averaged out the current monthly charge per user for the entire Government of Guam is less than a dollar (\$1.00) per user. Appellant has stated in their comment that their best offer has been \$39.00.

CONCLUSION

All procurement files regarding this matter as explained above have been submitted to the OPA thus Appellant's request for an order to compel BIT to produce more document's should be denied. The digital recordings WS400105/116/121-133 which Appellant requests are not part of the RFP-OOG-023 procurement file. The recorder is a personal recording device of Mary Mendiola which she uses to record her classes or training and delete thereafter. (See attachment A) If Appellant is aware of a meeting date that was not presented as part of the record then the specific date should be brought to the BIT's attention.
