13	I, ANTONIO "TONY" MUNA, JR., declare as follows:	
14	1. I am a Computer Specialist working at the Guam Visitors Bureau ("GVB").	
15		
16	2. I was involved with the development and issuance of Multi-Step Bid No. GVB-2014	
17	002MS.	
18	2. The CCTV surveillance system currently in the Tumon area was originally installed by	
19	Duty Free Shoppers ("DFS") sometime in 2000 or 2001.	
20	3. A number of the security cameras broke down when Super Typhoon Pongsona struck the	
2122	island in December of 2002.	
23	4. DFS had transferred monitoring of the surveillance systems to the Guam Police	
24	Department ("GPD"); however, GPD did not have the financial resources to maintain the system.	
25	5. GVB began discussions to assess the existing CCTV surveillance systems for upgrades	
26	and new additional CCTV infrastructure, including maintenance services and 24/7 system	
27	monitoring	

- 6. GVB discussed the specifications needed for upgrades and/or additional CCTV infrastructure with Jeffrey Muth, then DFS Security Manager, because Mr. Muth was responsible for the original installation of the cameras by DFS and familiar with the system.
 - 7. There were two (2) meetings held with Mr. Muth to develop the IFB specifications.
- 8. The first meeting was held on January 11, 2012, at the GVB office, with me, Mr. Muth, and Jon Nathan Denight, GVB Deputy General Manager.
- 9. The second meeting was held on March 4, 2012, at the GPD Tumon Precinct, with me, Mr. Muth, Jon Nathan Denight, Karl Pangelinan, GVB General Manager, Joann Camacho from DFS Guam, and GPD Captain Ray Perez from the Tumon Precinct.
- 10. In December of 2012, the Guam Legislature passed Bill 502-31 which appropriated \$150,000 from the Tourism Attraction Fund to update and replace the outdated security camera system along Pale San Vitores and Gov. Carlos Camacho Road.

I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the Territory of Guam that the aforementioned is true and correct.
