Once again, the Guam Community College leads in the area of fiscal discipline and responsibility. According to the Office of Public Accountability, "Deloitte & Touche, LLP, rendered an unmodified (clean) opinion on GCC's financial statements and compliance over major federal programs. Our campus modernization and expansion continued with the opening of the newly renovated Building 100 (now part of the modern, LEED certified Building E).

OUR OUTLOOK

INNOVATION

In 2019, GCC applied for approval of its first four-year degree program in Career and Technical Education, which is aimed to help address the qualified teacher shortage our secondary schools are facing. Once approved by the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC), we will be teaching and raising the next generation of educators with applicable expertise in the areas they are teaching.

GCC launched the Associate of Science in Practical Nursing in Fall 2019, which expanded the program from a one-year certificate program. Graduates will enter the medical field as LPNs, once they've passed the NCLX-PN.

In Fall 2019, GCC also began offering textbook subscriptions to our students, allowing them to access their requisite textbooks online for the semester for a nominal subscription fee, rather than purchasing a hard copy textbook. This should help reduce the cost for students.

CHALLENGES

Retention and completion rates remain stagnant. New methods and plans will be developed to address this challenge.

Decline in enrollment numbers have been experienced by the college during FY2019.

HIGHLIGHTS

On March 1, 2019, GCC hosted the Regional CTE Summit, Building Leadership Capacity in CTE in the Pacific Region: Successes, Challenges and Opportunities. Participants from Guam Community College, the University of Guam, the Northern Marianas College, Palau Community College, and the College of the Marshall Islands, discussed best practices for Career and Technical Education.

GCC's Job Fair was held at the Multipurpose Auditorium in February 27, 2019. Interested jobseekers from high school graduates and those looking for a change in careers to the senior citizens looking at post-retirement opportunities.

Thirty-one local and regional businesses and organizations from various industries participated – from hospitality, hotel management, the financial sectors, technology and even federal agencies.

GCC is collaborating with the Guam Department of Labor and private sector partners to build opportunities for all members of our community to learn in-demand skills that lead to high paying careers. In FY2019, we launched preapprenticeship programs designed to prepare participants for apprenticeship opportunities. During 2019, we held our second Construction Boot Camp and our first Ship Repair Transportation Boot Camp. Completers were hired as apprentices within their respective trades.

CAMPUS FACILITIES

Building 100 was completed and now houses the Criminal Justice and Developmental Education classrooms and offices. It boasts the same LEED compliant features as the adjoined Building E.

Building 300's renovation project continues and is expected to complete in 2020, and will house GCC's new multipurpose auditorium.

Groundbreaking for the **DNA Forensic Lab** is also expected in late 2019, adjacent to the existing Crime Lab facility.
