On June 13, 2018, the Guam Community College received notice from ACCJC of its action to reaffirm accreditation for the next seven (7) years after a successful visit by a peer review team in March 2018. The review team had no recommendations for compliance and improvements for the Guam Community College.


The Guam Community College began to "Close the Loop" with its 2014-2020 Institutional Strategic Master Plan. The College had determined that the goals and initiatives set forth by the 2014-2020 ISMP had been completed by the various Offices, Departments and Programs involved.

GCC received its 18th consecutive clean audit from the Office of Public Accountability (OPA) signifying the college's continuous support towards fiscal responsibility.

The official launch of the Future Builders of Guam Construction Boot Camp took place last year from July 2 to August 10. The free program yielded 33 participants who received specialized training in various construction trades. Students also received various certifications necessary when working with federal contracts. The program addresses the need for skilled construction workers given the chronic shortage of these skilled workers on Guam.

COST OF ATTENDANCE PER YEAR



OUR OUTLOOK

INNOVATION

Degree Works is on the horizon for GCC students. DegreeWorks is a platform that students can use to create a clear educational path with GCC. The service lays out the courses students need to take each semester in order to successfully complete their program on time.

GCC has planned its move to the "Cloud" as part of its integrated banner system. This will open up more innovative ways for the college to operate and provide services.

Final plans have been approved for the **Practical Nursing** Associates in Science program. The College will officially launch this program in Fall 2019.

GCC put out a bid for the development of its **new website**. The College looks forward to a new digital home with new modern innovative features and a website that is more user-friendly to our students, employees and visitors. The website will officially launch in 2019.

HIGHLIGHTS

The launch of the CTE Telecommunications Program began on September 2018 at Tiyan High School. The secondary CTE Telecommunications program will provide a direct pathway into the GCC postsecondary associate degree in computer science program where students can enter with 19 credits in this program already!

New Articulation Agreements with Colleges in the Asia region continue to rise including an agreement with BaekSeouk Univeristy in Korea. GCC students emerged in intimate lessons about Korean culture and language during the class's visit last year.

GCC's Business and Visual Communications programs hosted LinkUp, a reverse job fair that brings together employers and students. The "reverse" approach lets students showcase their skills and what they can offer companies.

PROGRESS

CLYMER results from FY 2018 continue to provide evidence consistent for both Math and English with success rates at a little over 90% of participants successfully completing with a "C" or better and approximately 80% with a "B" or better.

The GCC Cosmetology Industry Certification Program is back! After revisiting the program and conducting some overhauling, the program became available once again in Spring of 2018. The program also got a new home at GCC's Building A with the renovation of three adjoining classrooms. Check out their new home and the services they provide!

CHALLENGES

Retention and completion rates remain stagnant. New methods and plans will be developed to address this challenge.

Untimely allotment from GovGuam continues.

Decline in enrollment numbers have been experienced by the college during the FY 2018.
