GPA'S MOTION TO DISMISS PROCUREMENT APPEAL AS MOOT

I. Introduction.

The Guam Power Authority (GPA) hereby moves to dismiss this appeal as moot.

II. Facts.

In January of this year, GPA issued Multi-Step Invitation for Bids GPA-023-23 for a performance management contract (PMC) for the Yigo diesel generators. On or about May 23, 2023, GPA rejected as non-responsive the bid submitted by appellant Dooik Eng Co., Ltd.

Typhoon Mawar struck Guam on and about May 24, 2023.

Dooik launched a protest on May 30, 2023, which was denied, then perfected this procurement appeal on or about September 18, 2023, which imposed an automatic stay on the procurement under MS IFB GPA-023-23. In November, GPA unsuccessfully sought to lift the stay of the procurement through a determination of substantial interest. *See* GPA's Mot. re

Substantial Interest, Nov. 13, 2023 (denied at Mot. Hr'g, Nov. 27, 2023). The matter proceeded to a hearing on the merits on December 19, 2023.

At the merits hearing, the Public Auditor directed the parties' attention to the OPA's decision in In re Johndel Int'l, Inc. dba JMI-Edison, Appeal Case No. OPA-PA-23-002, which held that the Guam International Airport Authority could not justify an emergency procurement for its baggage handling system based on the appellant's procurement protest, when the alleged emergency could have been avoided through better management practices.

GPA interpreted the decision as suggesting that in the absence of a determination of substantial interest in this case, it would be better to cancel an allegedly flawed procurement than to pursue a potentially years-long appellate process. In addition, GPA obtained authorization to proceed with the procurement of temporary power, necessitating the reconfiguration of the Yigo diesel generators PMC project. GPA therefore cancelled MS IFB GPA-023-23 on December 21, 2023, Ex. A (Mem. re Cancellation of MS IFB GPA-023-23, Dec. 21, 2023), and issued cancellation letters to all of the bidders on or about December 22, 2023. Exs. B (Notices of Cancellation of Procurement, Dec. 22, 2023) & C (Mem. re Appointment of Acting Gen. Manager, Dec. 14, 2023).

GPA now moves to dismiss this procurement appeal as moot.

III. Legal Argument.

"Mootness is a jurisdictional question because [tribunals are] not empowered to decide moot questions or abstract propositions." North Carolina v. Rice, 404 U.S. 244, 246 (1971) (citations and internal quotation marks omitted). A case is moot "when the issues are no longer live or the parties lack a legally cognizable interest in the outcome. Mootness can arise at any stage of litigation. . . . [A]n appeal should be dismissed as moot when, by virtue of an intervening

event, the [reviewing body] cannot grant effectual relief whatever in favor of the appellant." Town House Dep't Stores v. Ahn, 2000 Guam 32 ¶ 9.

Many courts have "consistently found that the cancellation of a procurement renders a protest of that procurement moot." Coastal Env't Group, Inc. v. United States, 114 Fed. Cl. 124, 131 (Fed. Cl. 2013). In this appeal, Dooik seeks an order of the Public Auditor compelling GPA to find Dooik's proposal acceptable (or potentially acceptable) and allow Dooik to advance to Step 2 of the IFB. Comment to Agency Report, 7 (Oct. 13, 2023); Dooik's Hr'g Br., 11 (Dec. 11, 2023); Notice of Appeal, 3 (Sept. 18, 2023). Alternatively, Dooik asks the Public Auditor to issue an order cancelling the procurement altogether based on GPA's alleged errors in the procurement, including failure to consult with the Attorney General, errors related to the scoresheet and scoring, and the method of solicitation. Id.

GPA has cancelled the procurement, a form of relief sought by Dooik, in order to reconfigure the project. The cancellation of the procurement has rendered Dooik's other remedy. advancement to Step 2, meaningless. As a result, the Public Auditor cannot grant effectual relief in Dooik's favor. GPA's cancellation of MS IFB GPA-023-23 for the PMC has thus rendered Dooik's protest moot. The Public Auditor should therefore dismiss this matter as moot.

IV. Conclusion.

In light of the foregoing, GPA asks that this procurement appeal be dismissed as moot. Respectfully submitted this 26th day of December, 2023.

Yigo Diesels Performance Management Contract (PMC)

The purpose of this memo is to notify you of my decision to cancel the Yigo Diesels Performance Management Contract (PMC) Multi-Step Invitation for Bid (MS GPA-023-23).

I have determined that the cancellation of this bid is in the best interests of GPA and the government of Guam pursuant to 2 GAR Div. 4 § 3115 for the following reasons.

This bid was issued in January 2023 to provide critical performance management services for the Authority's 40MW Yigo Diesel generators. A stay of procurement was placed on September 18, 2023 due to an appeal to the Office of Public Accountability.

In May 2023, Typhoon Mawar significantly damaged the 20MW Yigo CT unit. The unit is undergoing repairs in Texas and is expected to arrive on Guam in February. The 198MW Ukudu power plant project completion date is now delayed from April 2024 to January 2026 due to the irreparable damage to the fuel and water tanks by Typhoon Mawar, requiring re-construction of the tanks. The Authority is addressing the need for generation capacity by restoring down units and improving the generation output of operating units.

The CCU and PUC approved and authorized GPA to procure 40MW of temporary power services to be commissioned within 100 days of the notice to proceed until the 2026 commissioning of the Ukudu plant to address the urgent need for power capacity demand before May 2024. GPA considered several potential sites to place the temporary power generators. This week, GPA determined the most viable sites for the temporary power services as Yigo (for diesel engines) and Tenjo (for combustion engines), primarily due to air permitting and fuel availability considerations.

The Yigo site currently houses the Yigo diesel generators, the subject of this current bid. The award of the temporary power bid will require the removal of these generators. While it is possible for the generators to be assessed and repaired at another location, the immediate operation (power generation capability) of such is unlikely as the necessary permitting and infrastructure are not available at alternate sites. Furthermore, amendments to the bid scope of work would significantly differ from that originally contained in the current bid.

Additionally, the Public Auditor, in a hearing on *In re Dooik Eng Co., Ltd.*, Case No. OPA-PA-23-004, suggested that in the absence of a determination of substantial interest, it is better to cancel an allegedly flawed procurement
