Statement Supporting the Appeal

1. Introduction and Background

JJ Global Services, Inc. ("JJ Global"), the Appellant, hereby submits this statement of grounds for appeal to the Office of Public Accountability, challenging the decision made by the Guam Department of Education (GDOE) regarding the non-transparent, unfair and award of contracts violative of the integrity of Guam's Procurement Process, Procurement Organization and the purposes of the Procurement Law. This appeal is based on procedural irregularities, inappropriate unfair and non-transparent termination of services, unfair and non-transparent inclusion of regions under existing contracts, and misleading amendments, as initially outlined in JJ Global's original protest.

GDOE issued IFB 007-2023 on 1/11/23. Exh. 13. IFB 007-2023 was amended on 1/24/23. The Scope of Work included Grounds Maintenance, Mowing, Edging, Grass Clippings/Blowing, and Tree Maintenance and the term of the contract was for one year with the option to renew for up to four additional one-year terms. The specific properties for the services included the following:

JJ Global submitted its response to IFB No. 007-2023 on or about 2/1/23. Exh. 8.

GDOE notified JJ Global of the award for Kattan 1 and Haya 1 District Schools (hereinafter, the "GDOE Properties") on 3/8/23. The Notice of Award stated that it did not form a contract until execution of a separate contract. Exh. 14. Instead of providing a contract, GDOE issued a purchase order for the services for the GDOE Properties on 3/30/23. Exh. 15. On 9/27/24,

GDOE notified JJ Global that it would issue a purchase order to continue the services for the GDOE Properties. No contract had been executed to that point in time, although the notification for Continuance of Services referenced IFB 007-2023 as being incorporated into the notice. Exh. 1.

On 12/18/24, GDOE advertised IFB 002-2025 for grounds maintenance services with a bid submission date of 1/7/25. Exh. 3. On 12/19/24, JJ Global sent a letter to GDOE notifying if of discrepancies and requesting clarification of GDOE's intentions and resolution regarding IFB 002-2025 and IFB 007-2023. On 12/26/24, GDOE made 2 amendments to IFB 002-2025. Exh. 12. On 12/26/25, JJ Global followed up on its letter of 12/19/24 with another letter. Exh. 20. On 1/6/24 JJ, Global sent an email to GDOE asking for a response to its letters.

No response came, and at no time did GDOE inform JJ Global of a deficiency in its performance under IFB 007-2023. Exh. 9. Instead, GDOE notified JJ Global on 1/6/25 that the Letter of Continuance would be terminated effective 1/7/25. Exh. 5. JJ Global then protested the solicitation of IFB 002-2025. Exh. 21. JJ Global also asked GDOE for reasons for the termination of services for the GDOE Properties.

On 1/7/25, the Guam PDN published a story that was inaccurate, placed JJ Global in an unfavorable light, prejudiced JJ Global and was libelous. This was the first time that JJ Global became aware of any alleged deficiencies with its performance under IFB 007-2023. *See* Exh. 11. JJ Global's letter caused the Guam PDN to correct its story. Exh. 17. JJ Global also sent a second letter of protest to GDOE on 1/7/25. Exh. 19. Despite the Guam PDN's inaccuracies, allegations of deficient services under IFB 007-2023 were obviously unsubstantiated as GDOE's issued a purchase order on 1/30/25 for services under IFB 007-2023 for GDOE's properties.

On 2/28/25, GDOE denied JJ Global's protest. Exh. 7.

2. Grounds for Appeal

The Guam Supreme Court ("SCOG") has emphasized the importance of maintaining a procurement system of quality and integrity. *DFS Guam LP v. A.B. Won Pat Int'l Airport Auth.*, 2020 Guam 20. The SCOG highlighted the necessity of adhering to statutory requirements to ensure fairness and compliance with the law. *Fleet Serv., Inc. v. Dept. of Admin.*, 2006 Guam 6.

a. Procedural Irregularities

Failure to Adhere to Established Procedures: GDOE failed to follow its own established procurement procedures, resulting in an arbitrary and capricious decision-making process. The lack of transparency and adherence to procedural norms undermines the integrity of the procurement process and violates the principles of fair competition.

Inadequate Notice and Opportunity to Respond: JJ Global was not provided with adequate notice or a fair opportunity to respond to the allegations leading to the termination of services. This procedural oversight deprived JJ Global of its right to due process, as guaranteed under applicable procurement regulations. When combined with hasty, unexplained termination, lack of notice of deficient performance to allow it to remedy any deficiencies, and bad publicity, the lack of due process prejudiced its ability to timely and fairly prepare and submit a bid for IFB 002-2025.

Unfair, Non-Transparent and Inappropriate Termination of Services: The termination of JJ Global's services was executed without sufficient justification or evidence of non-performance. GDOE's decision was based on unsubstantiated claims, lacking the necessary factual basis to support such a drastic measure. Notice of termination dated January 6, 2025 of Letter of Continuance for services under IFB 007-2023 was sent without justification, transparency

or fairness and unfairly prejudiced Appellant's ability to respond to IFB 002-2025. The Purchasing Agency through communications and action hid its true intentions with respect to IFBs 002-2025.

Breach of Contractual Obligations: GDOE's termination of services constitutes a breach of the contractual obligations owed to JJ Global. The termination was executed without following the contractual dispute resolution mechanisms, thereby violating the terms agreed upon by both parties and affecting the fairness, transparency, good faith and honesty in fact of the procedures for bidding process employed in IFB 002-2025.

b. Inclusion of Regions Under Existing Contracts

Improper Inclusion of Regions: GDOE improperly included regions that were already under existing contracts with JJ Global in the new procurement process. This action not only contravenes the terms of the existing contracts but also creates an unfair competitive advantage for other bidders. The process employed by GDOE was not transparent or fair, and does not promote the integrity of the Procurement Law.

Conflict with Existing Contractual Rights: The inclusion of these regions disregards JJ Global's existing contractual rights and obligations, leading to potential conflicts and legal disputes. GDOE's actions undermine the stability and predictability of contractual relationships. The process employed by GDOE was not transparent or fair, and does not promote the integrity of the Procurement Law.

Ambiguity and Misrepresentation: The amendments issued by GDOE during the procurement process were misleading and ambiguous, causing confusion among bidders. These amendments combined with the late notice of termination failed to provide clear and accurate information, thereby affecting the ability of JJ Global to submit a competitive and informed bid.

c. Misleading Amendments

Failure to Clarify Material Changes: GDOE did not adequately clarify material changes introduced through the amendments, resulting in a lack of understanding and misinterpretation of the procurement requirements. This failure to communicate effectively together with the late and prejudicial notice of termination constitutes a procedural error that adversely impacted JJ Global's ability to respond to IFB 002-2025.

3. Conclusion

In light of the aforementioned grounds, JJ Global respectfully requests that the Office of Public Accountability review the decision made by GDOE, rectify the procedural and legal errors identified, and ensure a fair and just resolution. JJ Global thus asks the OPA to cancel the solicitation, require that GDOE publish the scope of work and identify all properties subject to the re-solicited bid with sufficient opportunity for all bidders to respond. JJ Global further asks the OPA to require that GDOE provide a letter identifying any deficiencies in its performance under IFB 007-2023 or disputing the Guam PDN article.

This is the Decision on protests received on January 6 and 7, 2025, regarding the Guam Department of Education ("GDOE") Invitation for Bid ("IFB") No. 002-2025 for Grounds Maintenance Services for Various GDOE Public Schools and Support Facilities. See 5 Guam Code Annotated ("GCA") Section ("§") 5425(d).

January 6, 2025, Letter of Protest Regarding Grounds Maintenance Services and Procurement Issues:

We are writing to formally protest the issuance and proceedings related to IFB 002-2025. The inclusion of regions currently under JJ Global's existing contract in this solicitation raises serious concerns regarding compliance with procurement laws and the assurances previously provided by the Guam Department of Education (GDOE).

GROUNDS FOR PROTEST

1. Inclusion of Regions Under IFB 007-2023

The solicitation for IFB 002-2025 improperly includes regions currently serviced under our existing contract (IFB 007-2023). This action directly contradicts prior assurances from GDOE that these regions would not be re-solicited while under our contract. We were misled by the amendments agreed upon by Anthony Quinata, as discussed by Kit Casin (JJ Global AGM), to exclude the nine schools. However, upon the issuance of Amendment 2, no changes were reflected whatsoever. We trusted your office to make the appropriate amendments, yet to no avail. As a result, JJ Global is being placed in an awfully disadvantaged position

Decision:

Decision on Protests re IFB 002-2025. Grounds Maintenance Services for Various GDOE Public Schools and Support Facilities Page 2 of 8

There is no active IFB contract for Grounds Maintenance Services for GDOE. Guam Procurement law requires that GDOE competitively solicit for every expenditure of public funds irrespective of their source. See 5 GCA § 5004(b). Therefore, in order to obtain Grounds Maintenance Services, Guam law mandates GDOE to solicit competitively for the service. See id.

This procurement was published on December 18, 2024, therefore prospective bidders knew or should have known the published specifications. Therefore, this protest issue regarding the specifications is barred by the statute of limitations. See 5 GCA § 5425(a).

Notwithstanding the lack of subject matter jurisdiction, Guam Procurement law states the Chief Procurement Officer shall prepare and issue specifications for supplies and services required by Guam. See 5 GCA § 5262(a). There is no law that authorizes prospective bidders to determine the specifications for competitive solicitations. Therefore, GDOE has the authority to prepare and issue specifications as required within IFB 002-2025.

2. Undermining Contractual Commitments

Your department explicitly directed JJ Global to continue services under IFB 007-2023, establishing a binding agreement for the second option year. The issuance of IFB 002-2025 disregards this agreement and threatens the continuity of essential grounds maintenance services.

Decision:

There are no active IFB contracts or renewals for Grounds Maintenance Services for GDOE. There is a temporary emergency procurement for grounds maintenance services. Guam law mandates GDOE to competitively solicit for Grounds Maintenance Services. See 5 GCA § 5004(b). Guam law also requires that the GDOE Chief Procurement Officer shall prepare and issue the specifications for the intended IFB. See 5 GCA § 5262(a); see also 2 GAR Div. 4 §§ 3108-3109. Therefore, IFB 002-2025 is properly prepared by the Government agency and is required in order for GDOE to properly procure Grounds Maintenance Services.

3. Violation of Procurement Integrity

The overlapping scope between IFB 002-2025 and the regions currently under IFB 007-2023 undermines transparency and fairness in the procurement process. This action disregards the principles of Guam Procurement Law, which require consistency and adherence to contractual obligations.

Decision:

This IFB was published on December 18, 2024. Therefore prospective bidders knew or should have known that this solicitation was published, and this specific protest issue is procedurally barred for lack of subject matter jurisdiction. See 5 GCA § 5425(a).

Notwithstanding that this issue has passed the statute of limitations, Guam law mandates that GDOE competitively solicit for any service that requires the expenditure of public funds. See 5 GCA § 5004(b). Government of Guam agencies are strictly prohibited from entering into agreements that are not competitively solicited or that have expired. See id. Here, there is no existing or active renewal for the previously solicited IFB. Therefore, GDOE is mandated by Guam law to seek competitive sealed bids in order to procure Grounds Maintenance Services.

ACTIONS SOUGHT

To address this matter and restore compliance with procurement policies, we request the following immediate actions:

4. Amend IFB 002-2025 to exclude all regions currently under JJ Global's contract (IFB 007-2023).

Decision:

This IFB was published on December 18, 2024. As such, this specific protest issue lacks subject matter jurisdiction and is therefore, denied. Notwithstanding the fatal procedural issue, there is no Guam law that allows for Government of Guam agencies to enter into an expired contract, or to ignore competitive procedure laws and enter into an agreement. Additionally, per Guam law, Government of Guam agencies shall create the specifications for IFBs. See 5 GCA § 5262(a). GDOE has the authority to issue IFB 002-2025 specifications as per the needs of the department. GDOE properly proceeded in creating and issuing specifications per its needs. Id.

5. Suspend All Proceedings Related to IFB 002-2025 until this protest is fully resolved.

Decision:

Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated Section 5425(g) states in relevant part:

In the event of a timely protest under Subsection (a) of this Section or under Subsection (a) of § 5480 of this Chapter, Guam shall not proceed further with the solicitation or with the award of the contract prior to final resolution of such protest, and any such further action is void, unless:

- (1) The Chief Procurement Officer or the Director of Public Works after consultation with and written concurrence of the head of the using or purchasing agency and the Attorney General or designated Deputy Attorney General, makes a written determination that the award of the contract without delay is necessary to protect substantial interests of Guam; and
- (2) Absent a declaration of emergency by I Maga'håga/Maga'låhi, the protestant has been given at least two (2) days notice (exclusive of Guam holidays); and
- (3) If the protest is pending before the Public Auditor or the Court, the Public Auditor or Court has confirmed such determination, or if no such protest is pending, no protest to the Public Auditor of such determination is filed prior to expiration of the two (2) day period specified in Item (2) of Subsection (g) of this Section.

See 5 GCA § 5425(g).

Pursuant to Guam law, GDOE and IFB 002-2025 are required to enter into an automatic stay, and GDOE shall only proceed in accordance to the relevant laws and regulations. *See id.*

DEADLINE FOR RESPONSE

6. We require a written response confirming your commitment to these actions no later than 5:00PM on Friday, January 24, 2024. Failure to address this protest in a timely and transparent manner will leave us no choice but to escalate this issue to the Office of Public Accountability (OPA) and pursue all available legal remedies.

Decision:

Guam law empowers Government of Guam purchasing agencies to issue decisions without this timeline imposed by an aggrieved protester. See 5 GCA § 5425(c). Additionally, the unenforceable deadline of January 24, 2024, has expired nearly a year before the protest itself was lodged. Lastly, there is no authority in Guam Procurement law allowing a prospective vendor's protest to control the decision date.

Regarding a protesters right to appeal, Guam law provides protesters the right to appeal any decision to the Public Auditor, and following a decision of the Public Auditor to the Superior Court, and subsequently to the Supreme Court of Guam. See 5 GCA §§ 5425(c)-(f).

<u>January 7, 2025, Second Letter of Protest and Demand for Cancellation of IFB 002-2025 Due to Procedural Irregularities and Unfair Treatment.</u>

We are writing to formally escalate our protest against the issuance and proceedings related to IFB 002-2025, specifically requesting the cancellation of the bid. Procedural irregularities and timing conflicts have placed JJ Global in a significantly disadvantaged position, undermining fairness and transparency in the procurement process. These issues have resulted in multiple levels of unfair treatment, further compounding the concerns we raised in our initial protest.

PRIMARY GROUNDS FOR BID CANCELLATION

7. Procedural Irregularities and Timing Conflict.

The issuance of GDOE's Letter of Termination of Services on January 6, 2025, with an effective date of January 7, 2025, coincided with the bid submission deadline for IFB 002-2025. This abrupt termination, occurring while JJ Global was already fulfilling its contractual obligations under IFB 007-2023, created a significant timing conflict and placed us at a substantial disadvantage in preparing a competitive bid.

As you may note, the issuance of a bid bond, a mandatory requirement for bid submission, typically takes 2-3 weeks to be processed by surety agencies. This timing overlap hindered our ability to secure the necessary financing and submit a timely and competitive bid.

This simultaneous termination of services and the bid deadline, while JJ Global was already performing our contractual duties, demonstrates a clear lack of adequate separation and spacing between these critical events orchestrated by GDOE. This situation violates fairness and transparency mandated under Guam Procurement Law. Moreover, proceeding with IFB 002-2025 under these circumstances risks operational disruption to critical services for schools, directly impacting GDOE's obligations to ensure uninterrupted maintenance.

Decision:

This procurement was published on December 18, 2024; therefore, prospective bidders knew or should have known the published specifications. Therefore, this protest of the specifications regarding bonding requirements is barred by the statute of limitations. See 5 GCA § 5425(a).

Notwithstanding this untimely protest issue, Guam law regarding bid security states in relevant part:

(a) Requirement for Bid Security. Bid security shall be required for all competitive sealed bidding for the procurement of supplies or services when the total price is estimated by the Chief Procurement Officer to exceed Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00). Bid security shall be a bond provided by a surety company authorized to do business in Guam, or the equivalent in cash, or otherwise supplied in a form satisfactory to the government of Guam. Nothing herein prevents the requirement of such bonds on the procurement of supplies or services totaling fewer than Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) when a written determination and justification for such requirement is included as an integral part of the Invitation for Bid solicitation package.

See 5 GCA § 5212.

Guam law mandates that a bid security shall be required by IFB 002-2025. *Id.* This legal requirement was met by and through the IFB published specifications, and prospective bidders were made aware. *See* IFB 002-2025, section 3.1.16 Bond Requirements, Performance, and Payment Guarantees. Therefore, the bonding requirement within IFB 002-2025 does not violate fairness and transparency, but rather is mandatory for compliance with Guam Procurement law. Additionally, prospective bidders as well as the purchasing agency may have multiple options for bid security, so long as the GDOE proceeds in accordance with Title 5 GCA section 5212. *See* 5 GCA § 5212.

Regarding bidding time, pursuant to 2 GAR Div. 4 § 3109(d), Bidding time is the period of time between the date of distribution of an Invitation for Bids and the time and date set for receipt of bids....and a minimum of 15 days shall be provided unless a shorter time is deemed necessary for a particular procurement as determined in writing by the procurement officer. See 2 GAR Div. 4 § 3109(d).

Here, IFB 002-2025 was published and distributed on December 18, 2024. The deadline for submission of bids was January 7, 2025. See IFB 002-2025, section 1.1. Invitation for Bid Timeline. Therefore, prospective bidders knew or should have known about the deadline for submissions since December 18, 2024. For these reasons, this protest issue is untimely and barred. See 5 GCA § 5425(a).

Notwithstanding the lack of subject matter jurisdiction, IFB 002-2025 provided approximately 20 days in comparison to the requirement of 15 days. See 2 GAR Div. 4 § 3109(d). Therefore, prospective bidders were provided more than the reasonable amount of time from IFB date of issuance to the bid submission date, in accordance with Guam law, rules and regulations. Id.

8. Inappropriate Termination of Services

The Notice of Termination, issued on January 6, 2025, with an effective date of January 7, 2025, constitutes a clear violation of proper notification protocols. Given the exceptionally short notice period, GDOE failed to provide an adequate timeframe for terminating our existing contract. Moreover, the Notice of Termination does not clearly stipulate due cause for ending our services, further compounding the lack of clarity and fairness in this process. This abrupt action, coupled with the overlapping bid deadline, underscores multiple levels of unfair treatment, particularly considering that we had already begun fulfilling our contractual obligations in good faith on January 2, 2025. More critically, the unexpected termination severely compromised our cash flow and operational continuity.

The lack of an ample notice period violates procedural requirements, denying JJ Global the ability to adequately prepare for the termination or participate in subsequent solicitations without prejudice. Additionally, the termination of our services, without clear communication or justification, exacerbates the unfair treatment we have faced and underscores GDOE's procedural irregularity.

Decision:

The above protest issues are not regarding IFB 002-2025. Rather, these issues are surrounding the previous procurement to IFB 002-2025. There is no active IFB for grounds maintenance services, and thus necessitating IFB 002-2025. GDOE does not have the authority to resurrect expired agreements or to enter into another agreement that is not competitively solicited. See 5 GCA § 5004(b). For these reasons, GDOE is required by Guam law to seek competitive sealed bids in order to have grounds maintenance services. Id.

SUPPORTING GROUNDS FOR BID CANCELLATION

We addressed these issues in our initial Letter of Protest dated January 6, 2025, and we are reiterating them here for further emphasis and resolution:

9. Inclusion of Regions Under IFB 007-2023

The solicitation for IFB 002-2025 improperly includes regions currently serviced under our existing contract (IFB 007-2023). This action directly contradicts prior assurances from GDOE that these regions would not be re-solicited while under our contract, further contributing to multiple levels of unfair treatment.

Decision:

This protest issue is similar to issue item No. 1 listed above, thus the analysis applies here as well.

There is no active IFB contract for Grounds Maintenance Services for GDOE. Guam Procurement law requires that GDOE competitively solicit for every expenditure of public funds irrespective of their source. See 5 GCA § 5004(b). Therefore, in order to obtain Grounds Maintenance Services, Guam law mandates GDOE to solicit competitively for the service. See id.

This procurement was published on December 18, 2024, therefore prospective bidders knew or should have known the published specifications. Therefore, this protest issue regarding the specifications is barred by the statute of limitations. See 5 GCA § 5425(a).

Notwithstanding the lack of subject matter jurisdiction, Guam Procurement law states the Chief Procurement Officer shall prepare and issue specifications for supplies and services required by Guam. See 5 GCA § 5262(a). There is no law that authorizes prospective bidders to determine the specifications for competitive solicitations. Therefore, GDOE has the authority to prepare and issue specifications as required within IFB 002-2025. *Id*.

10. Misleading Amendments

We were misled by the amendments agreed upon by Anthony Quinata, as discussed by Kit Casin (JJ Global AGM), to exclude nine schools under our care in the new solicitation (IFB 002-2025).

However, upon the issuance of Amendment 2, no changes were reflected whatsoever. We trusted your office to make the appropriate amendments, yet to no avail. This oversight has placed JJ Global in a severely disadvantaged position, compromising our ability to compete fairly.

Decision:

Prospective bidders are not entitled to decide the specifications of a competitive sealed bid. Rather, Guam law strictly requires the Chief Procurement Officer of a Government agency to prepare and issue specifications for an IFB. See 5 GCA § 5262(a).

ACTIONS SOUGHT

To address these multiple levels of unfair treatment and restore compliance with procurement policies, we request the following immediate actions:

11. Cancel IFB 002-2025 to correct procedural flaws, ensure fairness, and suspend all proceedings related to the bid until these issues are fully resolved.

Decision:

Pursuant to Guam law, GDOE and IFB 002-2025 are required to enter into an automatic stay, and GDOE shall only proceed in accordance to the relevant laws and regulations. See 5 GCA § 5425(g).

12. Provide clarification on the rationale for including regions currently under JJ Global's contract in the new solicitation.

Decision:

GDOE does not have an active IFB contract for Grounds Maintenance Services. Guam law mandates that GDOE shall competitively procure such services. See 5 GCA § 5004(b). Guam Procurement law states the Chief Procurement Officer shall prepare and issue specifications for supplies and services required by Guam. See 5 GCA § 5262(a). There is no law that authorizes prospective bidders to determine the specifications for competitive solicitations. Therefore, GDOE has the authority to prepare and issue specifications as required within IFB 002-2025 and to meet GDOE's needs.

13. DEADLINE FOR RESPONSE

We require a written response confirming your commitment to these actions no later than 5:00 PM on Friday, January 13, 2025. Failure to address this protest in a timely and transparent manner will leave us no choice but to escalate this issue further to the Office of Public Accountability (OPA) and pursue all available legal remedies.

JJ Global remains committed to ensuring uninterrupted grounds maintenance services for GDOE schools. However, we cannot allow procedural oversights and unfair practices to undermine our rights and the integrity of the procurement process. We respectfully urge GDOE to uphold its obligations under Guam Procurement Law and take immediate corrective actions.

We await your prompt response.

Decision:

Decision on Protests re IFB 002-2025. Grounds Maintenance Services for Various GDOE Public Schools and Support Facilities Page 8 of 8

Guam law empowers Government of Guam purchasing agencies to issue decisions without this timeline imposed by an aggrieved protester. See 5 GCA § 5425(c). Lastly, there is no authority in Guam Procurement law allowing a prospective vendor's protest to control the decision date.

Regarding a protesters right to appeal, Guam law provides protesters the right to appeal any decision to the Public Auditor, the Superior Court, and subsequently to the Supreme Court of Guam. See 5 GCA $\S\S$ 5425(c)-(f).

For the aforementioned reasons, these protests have been denied in their entirety.

Pursuant to 5 GCA § 5425(e), you are hereby advised that you have a right to administrative and judicial review as allowed by the Guam Procurement Law. You may appeal the decision to the Guam Office of the Public Auditor within fifteen (15) days.

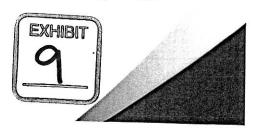

However, upon the issuance of Amendment 2, no changes were reflected whatsoever. We trusted your office to make the appropriate amendments, yet to no avail. As a result, JJ Global is being placed in an awfully disadvantaged position.

2. Undermining Contractual Commitments

Your department explicitly directed JJ Global to continue services under IFB 007-2023, establishing a binding agreement for the second option year. The issuance of IFB 002-2025 disregards this agreement and threatens the continuity of essential grounds maintenance services.

3. Violation of Procurement Integrity

The overlapping scope between IFB 002-2025 and the regions currently under IFB 007-2023 undermines transparency and fairness in the procurement process. This action disregards the





principles of Guam Procurement Law, which require consistency and adherence to contractual obligations.

To address this matter and restore compliance with procurement policies, we request the following immediate actions:

- Amend IFB 002-2025 to exclude all regions currently under JJ Global's contract (IFB 007-2023).
- 2. Suspend All Proceedings Related to IFB 002-2025 until this protest is fully resolved.

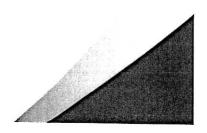

Any computer employee who meets the applicable compensation requirements and the above duties test qualifies as an exempt computer professional under both section 13(a)(1) and section 13(a)(17) of the Fair Labor Standards Act. (Field Assistance Bulletin No. 2006-3 (Dec. 14, 2006)). Accordingly, this wage determination will not apply to any exempt computer employee regardless of which of these two exemptions is

2) AIR TRAFFIC CONTROLLERS AND WEATHER OBSERVERS - NIGHT PAY & SUNDAY PAY: If you work at night as part of a regular tour of duty, you will earn a night differential and receive an additional 10% of basic pay for any hours worked between 6pm and 6am. If you are a full-time employed (40 hours a week) and Sunday is part of your regularly scheduled workweek, you are paid at your rate of basic pay plus a Sunday

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premium of 25% of your basic rate for each hour of Sunday work which is not overtime (i.e. occasional work on Sunday outside the normal tour of duty is considered overtime work).

** HAZARDOUS PAY DIFFERENTIAL **

An 8 percent differential is applicable to employees employed in a position that represents a high degree of hazard when working with or in close proximity to ordnance, explosives, and incendiary materials. This includes work such as screening, blending, dying, mixing, and pressing of sensitive ordnance, explosives, and pyrotechnic compositions such as lead azide, black powder and photoflash powder. All dry-house activities involving propellants or explosives. Demilitarization, modification, renovation, demolition, and maintenance operations on sensitive ordnance, explosives and incendiary materials. All operations involving re-grading and cleaning of artillery ranges.

A 4 percent differential is applicable to employees employed in a position that represents a low degree of hazard when working with, or in close proximity to ordnance, (or employees possibly adjacent to) explosives and incendiary materials which involves potential injury such as laceration of hands, face, or arms of the employee engaged in the operation, irritation of the skin, minor burns and the like; minimal damage to immediate or adjacent work area or equipment being used. All operations involving, unloading, storage, and hauling of ordnance, explosive, and incendiary ordnance material other than small arms ammunition. These differentials are only applicable to work that has been specifically designated by the agency for ordnance, explosives, and incendiary material differential pay.

** UNIFORM ALLOWANCE **

If employees are required to wear uniforms in the performance of this contract (either by the terms of the Government contract, by the employer, by the state or local law, etc.), the cost of furnishing such uniforms and maintaining (by laundering or dry cleaning) such uniforms is an expense that may not be borne by an employee where such cost reduces the hourly rate below that required by the wage determination. The Department of Labor will accept payment in accordance with the following standards as compliance:

Conformance Process:

The contracting officer shall require that any class of service employee which is

not listed herein and which is to be employed under the contract (i.e., the work to be performed is not performed by any classification listed in the wage determination), be classified by the contractor so as to provide a reasonable relationship (i.e., appropriate level of skill comparison) between such unlisted classifications and the classifications listed in the wage determination (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(i)). Such conforming procedures shall be initiated by the contractor prior to the performance of contract work by such unlisted class(es) of employees (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(ii)). The Wage and Hour Division shall make a final determination of conformed classification, wage rate, and/or fringe benefits which shall be paid to all employees performing in the classification from the first day of work on which contract work is performed by them in the classification. Failure to pay such unlisted employees the compensation agreed upon by the interested parties and/or fully determined by the Wage and Hour Division retroactive to the date such class of employees commenced contract work shall be a violation of the Act and this contract. (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(v)). When multiple wage determinations are included in a contract, a separate SF-1444 should be prepared for each wage determination to which a class(es) is to be conformed.

The process for preparing a conformance request is as follows:

- When preparing the bid, the contractor identifies the need for a conformed occupation(s) and computes a proposed rate(s).
- 2) After contract award, the contractor prepares a written report listing in order the proposed classification title(s), a Federal grade equivalency (FGE) for each proposed classification(s), job description(s), and rationale for proposed wage rate(s), including information regarding the agreement or disagreement of the authorized representative of the employees involved, or where there is no authorized representative, the employees themselves. This report should be submitted to the contracting officer no later than 30 days after such unlisted class(es) of employees performs any contract work.
- 3) The contracting officer reviews the proposed action and promptly submits a report of the action, together with the agency's recommendations and pertinent information including the position of the contractor and the employees, to the U.S. Department of Labor, Wage and Hour Division, for review (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(ii)).
- 4) Within 30 days of receipt, the Wage and Hour Division approves, modifies, or disapproves the action via transmittal to the agency contracting officer, or notifies the contracting officer that additional time will be required to process the request.
- 5) The contracting officer transmits the Wage and Hour Division's decision to the contractor.
- 6) Each affected employee shall be furnished by the contractor with a written copy of such determination or it shall be posted as a part of the wage determination (See $29 \, \text{CFR} \, 4.6(b)(2)(iii)$).

Information required by the Regulations must be submitted on SF-1444 or bond paper.

When preparing a conformance request, the ""Service Contract Act Directory of Occupations"" should be used to compare job definitions to ensure that duties requested are not performed by a classification already listed in the wage determination. Remember, it is not the job title, but the required tasks that determine whether a class is included in an established wage determination. Conformances may not be used to artificially split, combine, or subdivide classifications listed in the wage determination (See 29 CFR 4.152(c)(1))."

UPDATED: GDOE seeks new contractor for grass cutting, other maintenance work

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(Editor's note: This story has been updated to include JJ Global Services statement that it "maintains an active contract with the Guam Department of Education" and other matters that took place, "including a formal protest filed with GDOE," among other things.) The Guam Department of Education is actively searching for a new contractor for grass cutting and other school grounds maintenance work after it said one company's agreement "lapsed" but still "performing the function" until a new agreement is finalized, and another issued a 30-day notice of non-renewal of contract.

"We are actively soliciting a new contract to ensure continued maintenance support," GDOE spokesperson Tess Reyes-Burrier told the Pacific Daily News. "We began developing the new contract in October."

She said the request for quotes closes on Jan. 25.

"We will then select a new contractor," she added.

In July 2024, Guam Cleaning Masters, which serviced about 26 campuses, provided a 30-day notice of non-renewal of its contract. It notified GDOE by email that it would not renew its contract expiring at the end of August.

This issue was discussed at a recent Guam Education Board meeting, where concerns were raised about contractors failing to meet obligations for grass-cutting services and the challenges schools face in maintaining their grounds.

"Only one contract lapsed, but they are still performing the function," Reyes-Burrier said. "The other company's contract did not lapse—they quit providing the service with 30 days' notice as per the contract."

The company with the "lapsed" contract with GDOE is JJ Global Services, according to GDOE's Reyes-Burrier. However, the company had an agreement with GDOE to continue providing ground maintenance until a new agreement was finalized.

"We did a Letter of Continuance agreed between us and JJ Global, prior to the contract expiring, for them to continue operating until we extend their old contract," Reyes-Burrier said.

On Wednesday, JJ Global Services president and CEO Luis Bustamante sent a letter clarifying that "JJ Global Services maintains an active contract with the Guam Department of Education (GDOE) and has consistently fulfilled its obligations under this agreement."

"Contrary to the recent Guam PDN article, our contract was neither terminated nor abandoned. Any changes to our contract or related procurement processes have been addressed through proper legal channels, including a formal protest filed with GDOE," Bustamante wrote. "JJ Global remains committed to providing reliable grounds maintenance services to GDOE."

Education Board Chairwoman Mary Okada emphasized the importance of rebidding the grass-cutting services since the current contractor cannot complete their term.

Vice Chairman Angel Sablan noted that while mayors have stepped in to handle the work, this is not a sustainable solution.

He also mentioned that mayors are demanding full reimbursement for the costs incurred.

Board members acknowledged mayors' efforts but called for a long-term solution.

They urged GDOE to expedite the new contracts for consistent groundskeeping services and are considering additional funding for municipalities to cover future maintenance needs.

In the meantime, village mayors and GDOE's maintenance staff are providing temporary relief by mobilizing municipal resources to maintain school facilities while the new contract is being solicited.

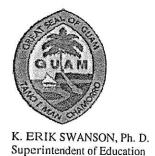

Section 2 - PROJECT DESCRIPTION

2.1. PROJECT TITLE

GDOE IFB 007-2023 GROUNDS MAINTEN ANCE SERVICES FOR VARIOUS GDOE SCHOOLS AND SUPPORT FACILITIES

2.2. PURPOSE

The Guam Department of Education (GDOE) is soliciting qualified and licensed Contractors to provide Ground Maintenance Service at thirty-five (35) GDOE public schools and two (2) GDOE operations facilities listed on ATTACHMENT - A.

The Contractor shall provide all necessary labor, material, transportation, supervision, equipment, field investigation and other incidental work required for the services stated herein. Other incidental work required includes any and all items and considerations necessary to ensure services are completed appropriately.

2.3. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

GROUNDS MAINTENANCE REQUIREMENTS AND SPECIFICATIONS

There are approximately four hundred twenty-two (422) acres of grass to cut throughout all schools and support facilities as indicated in ATTACHMENT A.

During the dry season, January through June, one (1) cut per month will be performed. As the months of July through December are rainy season months, one (1) cut will be performed every three (3) weeks during these months performed (a total of 8 cuts for the six months rainy season period). Once awarded, selected Contractor(s) will be required to turn in to Facilities Maintenance Division a tentative grass cutting schedule for each school awarded. Award will be based on the lowest, most responsive, and responsible bid for each District/Sub-District as detailed on the Bid Form (ATTACHMENT B).

NOTE: Contractor must provide an offer for ALL schools within each District/Sub-District. For example, if a Contractor chooses to provide an offer on Lagu 1 Schools, the offer must be for all Lagu 1 Schools. If Contractor decides not to offer on a District/Sub-District of schools, Contractor must submit a "NO Quote". Offers for select schools within a District will not be considered/entertained.

Delays due to Unforeseen Conditions or Conditions Outside of GDOE or Contractor's Control

It is the Contractor's responsibility to contact the GDOE Administrative Staff at the school site in regards to unforeseen circumstances such as rain, typhoon, or any other event which will prevent work from occurring on the prescheduled date. The Contractor must promptly and reasonably reschedule with the School Administrative Staff when work will commence. The GDOE will not be responsible for the rescheduling of the ground maintenance. Rescheduling from the Contractor must be done in a timely manner when it is safe to begin operations.

Contractor's Manpower and Equipment Resources

Potential Contractors must provide a list of direct support manpower (personnel) and equipment resources to be dedicated to this contract in order to be considered for award. The list must include current manpower (personnel) and equipment level and any additional manpower and equipment to be added. The list shall include expected time for new hire and new equipment acquisitions. This is crucial for consideration for award.

MOWING and Tree Maintenance

The contractor shall provide a minimum of two (2) day notice to School Administrative Staff before performing lawn or tree maintenance to allow the school ample time to schedule usage of the school grounds accordingly. Schools and/or support facilities shall be cut in accordance with the schedule submitted to the Facilities and Maintenance Division.

EDGING

All sidewalks, curbs, gutters, driveways, parking lots, buildings, shall be neatly edged to remove overhanging grass. Any grass or weeds growing in cracks and joints is to be removed. Where mowing cannot be done adjacent to buildings, signpost, benches, trees, bushes, and other obstructions, the grass shall be neatly clipped by use of trimmers or brush cutters, being careful not to damage cared for planters, planters, flowers, tree saplings, and signs.

The Contractor shall ensure that trimmers and brush cutters are operated in a safe manner and all protective guards are in place. Protective shields such as mesh nets shall be used when working around parked cars to protect from flying rocks and to ensure no

damages are done to any vehicles or property. The Contractor is responsible for any damages due to trimmer or brush cutting activities at no cost to GDOE. All walkways and parking areas are to be free of grass clipping and debris with each mowing.

The contractor shall ensure that all fenced in areas, e.g. pump stations, AC units, etc are cut.

GRASS CLIPPINGS/BLOWING

Grass clippings can be left during the dry season for added moisture and nutrients, except when clippings are clumping and excess piles are evident. Mulching using a mulching attachment on the mower can be used only during the dry season. During the rainy season (July to December), grass clippings will be removed by raking or mower vacuum to prevent excessive puddling of water. Sidewalks and parking areas must be power blown to remove debris. Contractor must take precaution to prevent blowing clippings into the classrooms. A method that will accomplish this will be to blow against the walls and doors so clippings are blown back away from the doorways.

Tree Maintenance

Maintenance of trees and shrubs are necessary to protect the safety of students, staff, and visitors and keep GDOE sites clear from unnecessary debris. The Contractor agrees to perform routine tree maintenance which entails the removal of low hanging or rotting branches as well as removal of obstructive or over grown trees. (Example: Flame tree and tongan tongan branch removal.) The Contractor must also address wounds done to the tree through pruning, by either painting or taring cuts to prevent rotting, decay and regrowth. Upon Completion of the work, the Contractor shall remove and properly dispose of all brush and debris from the work zone. If a major removal or cut of a tree must take place, it is the Contractor's responsibility to inform Facilities and Maintenance of extra cost and labor which may occur.

CONTRACT TERM

The initial award under this IFB shall expire one (1) year from the date of contract award with the option to renew for up to four (4) additional one (1) year terms.

CONTRACT MANAGEMENT

CONTRACTOR'S PERSONNEL MANAGEMENT

All Contractors are required to have sufficient staff to adequately service the area. All work is to be performed professionally and adequate supervision shall be maintained at all times. The Contractor will ensure that all personnel is outfitted with the necessary Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) following OSHA and Local Regulatory Standards.

The Contractor's employees or subcontractors must report to the School Main Office immediately upon entering campus and sign in as mandated by, 17 GCA Education, CH 7 Physical Plant, 7109 School Property: Unauthorized Entry. It is the Contractors responsibility to ensure that all GDOE Rules and Regulations and Guam Code Annotated 10 GCA Health and Safety Chapter 25, Institutional Facilities and Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS) requirements are met and followed. In the event new requirements or regulations from DPHSS are implemented, it is the responsibility of the contractor to ensure they are met at no additional cost to GDOE.

All contractors and subcontractor's personnel must be in company uniform and must have a company identification card worn visibly on the front of the uniform. Uniforms must have the company name and logo on the front or back of the uniform. Any personnel that does not have the proper identification and uniform will not be allowed on GDOE premises. GDOE reserves the right to require immediate replacement of any person employed whose continued presence is not in the best interest or is harmful to the safety of GDOE, its students, staff, or visitors, as determined by the GDOE Contract Manager, provided such replacement does not violate any local state, or federal law.

CONTRACTOR PERFORMANCE SURVEY (CPS) AND INVOICES

Contractor Performance Survey (CPS) forms shall be provided to the school or operations facility personnel within two (2) working days after completion of each cut. An authorized school personnel or operations facility personnel shall thoroughly inspect the contractor's performance and notify Contractor within two (2) working days of any unsatisfactory performance.

The authorized School or Operations Facility Site Administrative Staff or Administrator shall rate the Contractor's performance and return the completed form to the Contractor. A completed CPS Form for each service site must accompany Invoices.

Invoices will not be accepted without all the proper signed documents. Invoices will be turned in to GDOE Facilities Maintenance, 501 Mariner Avenue, Tiyan, Barrigada, Building A or emailed to Yolanda Duenas, Program Coordinator II, F&M Division at ymduenas@gdoe.net and Philip Toves, F&M Manager at patoves@gdoe.net. The Contractor will ensure that the contractor's copies

are signed, dated, and initialed by the person accepting invoices.

DISCREPANCIES, COMPLAINTS, AND PENALTIES

Should an Unsatisfactory Review occur u pon Inspection, the school representative shall notify the contractor by submitting a copy of the CPS, via email, to the Contractor with copies to F&M within two working days. The Contractor will be given five (5) working days to satisfactorily correct any deficiencies. Should the Contractor fail to correct a deficiency within the five day curing period, GDOE has the authority to make deductions at a prorated rate equal to the work value of the unfinished/unsatisfactory.

EXAMPLE: Total unfinished work equals one quarter (1/4) of the total area – a one quarter deduction will be taken from the total cut rate price (a minimum deduction of one half (1/2) of one acre cost will be made – Contractor's acre cost is \$50.00 - \$25.00 will be deducted) The amount deducted will be used to hire another contractor to complete the pending/unfinished/substandard work.

SITE VISITS AND INSPECTIONS

Potential contractors are encouraged to visit all locations, verify dimensions at each site, become familiar with and take into consideration site conditions which may affect the work.

Each contractor shall acquaint themselves thoroughly as to the character and nature of the work at each location. Additionally, each contractor will take full notice as to the difficulties to be encountered in the performance of the work at hand.

Prospective Offeror are responsible for inspecting each location they are interested in offering a quote to perform the services. Contractors will be presumed to have inspected the locations and to have read and to be thoroughly familiar with the scope of services intent. The fallure of any contractor to inspect the locations or examine the objective of the services and documents shall not be relieved from any obligation with respect to the Request for Quotation.

3.1.6. BID SUBMISSION FORM

All bids must be submitted on the Bid Form included with this IFB. Bidders may type or handwrite in ink their responses in the blank spaces provided on the bid form. 3.1.7. IRREVOCABLE BID PRICE

3.1.8. ALTERNATE OR MULTIPLE BIDS NOT ACCEPTED

Alternate or multiple bids will not be accepted. Any Bidder submitting alternate, multiple, or otherwise altered bid forms will be deemed nonresponsive and disqualified from this solicitation.

3.1.9. LATE BIDS NOT ACCEPTED

Bids received after the time and date specified in Section 3.1.4 - TIME AND DATE FOR RECEIPT OF BIDS will be considered nonresponsive and disqualified from consideration for award.

3.1.10. MODIFICATION OR WITHDRAWAL OF BIDS

Bids may be modified or withdrawn by written notice received from the Bidder prior to the time and date set for bid opening. Negligence from the Bidder in preparing the bid confers no right for the withdrawal of the bid after it has been opened.

3.1.11. TRADE SECRETS AND OTHER PROPRIETARY DATA

3.1.15. EXPLANATION TO BIDDERS

No oral explanation in regards to the meaning of the specification will be made and no oral instructions will be given before the award of the IFB. Discrepancies, omissions, or doubts as to the meaning of the specifications should be communicated in writing to the named contact individual of GDOE for interpretation before the deadline for written questions specified in Section 3.1.14 — PRE-BID WRITTEN QUESTIONS. Bidders should act promptly and allow sufficient time for a reply to reach them before submission of their bid. Interpretation, if required, shall be made in the form of an amendment to the IFB, which will be forwarded to all prospective Bidders.

3.1.16. BOND REQUIREMENTS, PERFORMANCE, AND PAYMENT GUARANTEES

Pursuant to 5 GCA §5212, A Bid Security is REQUIRED for this IFB. A bid guarantee or bid bond in the amount of not less than fifteen percent (15%) of the bidder's total bid price must be included with the bid. The bid guarantee may be in the form of a surety bond issued by a surety company authorized to do business in Guam, or in the form of a cashier's check, a certified check or a letter of credit.

3.2. GENERAL INFORMATION

3.2.1. EVALUATION FACTORS FOR AWARD

Determination of an award pursuant to this IFB will be made based on the lowest, most responsive and responsible bid(s).

GDOE reserves the right to disqualify bids that are deemed to be nonresponsive, regardless of whether the bid is determined to contain the lowest price. GDOE reserves the right to waive any minor informality or irregularity in the bids received.

In determining the lowest responsive bidder, GDOE will be guided by the following evaluation factors:

- a) Price of overall performance and delivery.
- b) Responsiveness to the requirements of this IFB.

Tie Bids: In the event GDOE receives lowest responsive bids from responsible bidders that are identical in price, determination of award will be made pursuant to 2 GAR Div. 4 §3109.

3.2.2. DETERMINATION OF RESPONSIBILITY

Responsibility of a bidder will be determined in accordance with 2 GAR Div. 4 §3116. Bidders should be prepared to promptly provide to GDOE information relating to the bidder's responsibility. Such information may include but is not limited to documentation of financial, personnel, and other resources; expertise; or records of performance. Failure of a bidder to comply with a request by GDOE for information relating to responsibility may result in a determination that a bidder is not responsible and therefore disqualified from an award.

Pursuant to 5 GCA §5201(g), responsiveness of a bidder will be determined by compliance with the requirements of this IFB.

3.2.3. NOTICE OF AWARD

Notice of Award shall constitute the official award of this IFB. Bidders submitting bids in response to this IFB will be notified in writing if their bid is determined to be the lowest most responsive and responsible bid. For solicitations over \$25,000, all bidders submitting bids will be notified in writing of the successfulness or unsuccessfulness of their response to this IFB. Written notice of award will be public information and made a part of the procurement file.

3.2.4. DURATION OF AWARD

The duration of this award shall be for one (1) year upon receipt of the, Notice to Proceed, and with the option to renew for up to four (4) additional one-year (1) periods, subject to the availability of funds and subject to the terms of the IFB. A modification to extend time to perform services may only be made with the consent of both parties in writing and on the condition that such modification shall not increase the costs for services hereunder.

In the event of contract cancellation due to unavailability of funds, Bidder will be reimbursed for unamortized, reasonably incurred, non-recurring costs. If contract is cancelled for lack of funds, Government will timely inform Contractor; but that neither party's rights under termination clause are affected.

3.2.5. OPTION TO RENEW

GDOE reserves the right to exercise its option to renew as specified in **Section 3.2.4 - DURATION OF AWARD** upon notification and mutual agreement of the contract and the Guam Department of Education consent of both parties, and is subject to the availability of funds. Prior to the start of any renewal terms, Contractor shall submit written assurance that it shall comply with the most recent Wage and Benefits Determination for Guam promulgated by the U.S. Department of Labor.

3.2.6. SPECIAL PERMITS AND LICENSES

The Bidder shall, at its own expense, procure all permits, certificates, and licenses and give all notices and necessary reports required by law for this IFB. Failure to maintain required licenses or permits shall be grounds for immediate termination of the contract.

3.2.7. CONTRACT TYPE

A Firm Fixed Price agreement will be consummated between the most responsible bidder and GDOE.

3.2.8. FUNDING SOURCE

Administered by the Guam Department of Education & funded by the American Rescue Plan - Outlying Area - State Education Agency.

3.2.9. DELIVERY OF GOODS

Bidder(s) who are awarded this solicitation guarantees that goods will be delivered or required services performed within the time specified. GDOE will issue a Notice to Proceed (NTP) and/or Purchase Order now of goods or services.

3.2.10. METHOD OF PAYMENT

The successful Bidder shall submit invoice(s) to GDOE for payment upon delivery of goods or required services as defined in

3.2.11. INSPECTION AND ACCEPTANCE OF GOODS

Bidders submitting blds in response to this IFB should be aware that GDOE will inspect and test all goods, supplies, materials or equipment delivered in response to this IFB. GDOE reserves the right to reject and, at its discretion, require replacement of those items that are determined to be defective in material, construction, workmanship, manufacturing, or performance and/or that do not conform to the specifications described in this IFB.

3.2.12. VENDOR PERFORMANCE

Bidder(s) who are awarded this solicitation may, at the discretion of GDOE, be monitored and assessed based on their performance. Vendor performance will be reviewed before, during, and after the supplies or services have been delivered or

The GDOE Supply Management Administrator or his/her designee may meet periodically with the selected Bidder for the purpose of reviewing progress and providing necessary guidance to the Bidder in solving issues.

3.2.13. JUSTIFICATION OF DELAY

If the Bidder cannot comply with the completion requirement agreed upon, it is the Bidder's responsibility to advise GDOE in writing explaining the cause and reasons of the delay. GDOE may make a reasonable extension of time.

3.2.14. LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

When the Contractor is given notice of delay or nonperformance as specified in 2GAR Div 4 § 6101(8) of the Termination for Default Clause of this IFB and fails to cure in the time specified, the Contractor shall be liable for damages for delay in the amount of one-fourth of one-percent (1%) of outstanding order per calendar day from date set for cure until either the territory reasonably obtains similar supplies or services if the vendor is terminated for default, or until the vendor provides the supplies or services if the vendor is not terminated for default. To the extent that the vendor's delay or nonperformance is excused under 2GAR Div 4 § 6101(8) (Excuse for Nonperformance or Delayed Performance) of the Termination for Default Clause of this IFB, liquidated damages shall not be due the territory. The Contractor remains liable for damages caused other than delay.

3.2.15. PHYSICAL LIABILITY

If it becomes necessary for the Vendor, either as principal, agent or employee, to enter upon the premises or property of Guam Department of Education in order to construct, erect, inspect, make delivery or remove property hereunder, the Vendor hereby covenants and agrees to take, use, provide and make all proper, necessary and sufficient precautions, safeguards and protections against the occurrence of any accidents, injuries or damages to any person or property during the progress of work herein covered, and to be responsible for, and to indemnify and save harmless the Guam Department of Education from the payment of all sums of money by reason of all or any such accidents, injuries or damages that may occur upon or about such work, and fines, penalties and loss incurred for or by reasons of the violations of any territorial ordinance, regulations, or the laws of Guam or the United States, while the work is in progress. Contractor will carry insurance to indemnify the Guam Department of Education against any claim for loss, damage or injury to property or persons arising out of the performance of the Contractor or his employees and agents of the services covered by the contract and the use, misuse or failure of any equipment used by the contractor or his employees or agents, and shall provide certificates of such insurance to the Guam Department of Education when required.

3.2.16. TAXES

All bidders are responsible for any taxes or fees that may be assessed or due for performance of work or delivery of services pursuant to this IFB. Specific information regarding Guam taxes may be obtained from the Guam Department of Revenue and

3.2.17. AUTHORITY TO ISSUE THIS IFB

This solicitation is issued subject to the Guam Procurement Act (5GCA Chapter 5) and applicable Guam Procurement

3.2.18. COSTS OF BID PREPARATION

All costs associated with preparation of a bid in response to this IFB shall be solely the Bidder's responsibility. GDOE shall not be liable for any costs incurred by a potential Bidder for the preparation of a bid.

3.2.19. BID SAMPLES AND DESCRIPTIVE LITERATURE

Pursuant to 2 GAR Div 4 §3109(e)(3), bid samples or descriptive literature should not be submitted to GDOE unless expressly requested within this IFB. Regardless of any condition set by a bidder, unsolicited bid samples or descriptive literature will not be examined, tested, or deemed to vary any of the requirements of this IFB.

3.2.20. BRAND NAME OR EQUAL

Pursuant to 2 GAR Div 4 §4103(b)(v), Any brand names used in this IFB are for the purpose of describing the standard of quality, performance, and characteristics desired and is not intended to limit or restrict competition. Substantially equivalent products to the brand specified will be considered for award.

3.2.21. CANCELLATION OF CONTRACTS

Pursuant to 2 GAR Div 4 §3121(e)(1)(G), in the event of a cancellation due to unavailability of funds, GDOE will notify the Contractor on a timely basis, and Contractor will be reimbursed the unamortized, reasonably incurred, nonrecurring costs. If contract is cancelled for lack of funds, Government will timely inform Contractor; but that neither party's rights under termination clause are affected.

3.2.22. TERMINATION OF CONTRACT

1.

GDOE reserves the right to cancel or terminate this Agreement prior to its completion for reasons including, but not limited to, the following:

- (i) Termination without Cause: GDOE may terminate this Agreement, without cause, upon the delivery of written notice to the Contractor at least thirty (30) days prior to the intended date of termination;
- (ii) Termination in the Best Interest of the Government of Guam: GDOE may terminate this Agreement based upon a determination that such termination is in the best interests of the Government of Guam by delivering a written notice of such termination to the Contractor and the effective date of such termination. Circumstances for termination under this clause include but are not limited to Contractor's successful completion of services under this Agreement to the satisfaction of GDOE.
- (iii) Termination for Cause/Default: If the Contractor refuses or fails to perform any of the provisions of this contract with such diligence as will ensure its completion within the time specified in this contract, or any extension thereof, otherwise fails to timely satisfy the contract provisions, or commits any other substantial breach of this contract, the Procurement Officer may notify the Contractor in writing of the delay or non-performance and if not cured in ten days or any longer time specified in writing by the Procurement Officer, such officer may terminate the Contractor's right to proceed with the contract or such part of the contract as to which there has been delay or a failure to properly perform. In the event of termination in whole or in part the Procurement Officer may procure similar supplies or services in a manner and upon terms deemed appropriate by the Procurement Officer. The Contractor shall continue performance of the contract to the extent it is not terminated and shall be liable for excess costs incurred in procuring similar goods or services.
- (iv) Termination for Convenience. The GDOE procurement officer may, when the interests of GDOE so require, terminate this contract in whole or in part, for the convenience of GDOE. The procurement officer shall give written notice of the termination to the Contractor specifying the part of the contract terminated and when termination becomes effective. The Contractor shall incur no further obligations in connection with the terminated work and on the date set in the notice of termination the Contractor will stop work to the extent specified. The Contractor shall also terminate outstanding orders and subcontracts as they relate to the terminated work. The Contractor shall settle the liabilities and claims arising out of the termination of subcontracts and orders connected with the terminated work. The procurement officer may direct the Contractor to assign the Contractor's right, title, and interest under terminated orders or subcontracts to GDOE. The Contractor must still complete the work not terminated by the notice of termination and may incur obligations as necessary to do so.

The Contractor shall submit a termination claim specifying the amounts due because of the termination for convenience together with cost or pricing data to the extent required by 2 GAR §3118. If the Contractor fails to file a termination claim within one year from the effective date of termination, the procurement officer may pay the Contractor, if at all, an amount set in accordance with this section. The procurement officer and the Contractor may agree to a settlement provided the Contractor has filed a termination claim as required herein and the settlement does not exceed the total contract price plus settlement costs reduced by payments previously made by GDOE and the contract price of the work not terminated. Absent agreement of a settlement, the procurement officer shall pay the Contractor the following amounts: with respect to all contract work performed prior to the effective date of the termination, the total, without duplication of any items, of: (a) the cost of such work plus a fair and reasonable profit on such portion of the work (such profit shall not include anticipatory profit or consequential damages) less amount paid or to be paid for completed portions of such work; provided that if it appears that the Contractor would have sustained a loss if the entire contract would have been completed, no profit shall be allowed or included and the amount of compensation shall be reduced to reflect the anticipated rate of loss; (b) cost of settling and paying claims arising out of the termination of subcontracts or orders pursuant to this clause. These costs must not include costs paid in accordance with subsection (a) above; (c) the reasonable settlement costs of the Contractor including accounting, legal, clerical, and other expenses reasonably necessary for the preparation of settlement claims and supporting data with respect to the terminated portion of the contract and for the termination and settlement of subcontracts thereunder. The total sum to be paid the Contractor under this subsection shall not exceed the total contract price plus the reasonable settlement costs of the Contractor reduced by the amount of payments otherwise made, the proceeds of any sales of supplies or materials under this section, and the contract price of work not terminated.

Section 4 - TERMS AND CONDITIONS

4.1. REFERENCE TO LAW AND REGULATIONS

Bids submitted in response to this IFB must fulfill the requirements identified in this IFB. Each of the forms identified herein must be completed and returned according to the instructions provided. The term "GCA" refers to the Guam Code Annotated. The term "GAR" refers to the Guam Administrative Regulations, Division 4, Procurement Regulations. Administration of this IFB shall be subject to the Guam Procurement Law at 5 GCA Chapter 5 and the procurement regulations at 2 GAR Division 4.

4.2. LIST OF FORMS REQUIRED FOR ALL SOLICITATIONS

Bidders must complete and submit originals of the forms identified throughout this IFB and collectively listed in Section 5 - FORMS REQUIRED IN RESPONSE TO IFB.

4.3. LAWS TO BE OBSERVED

The Bidder should be familiar with federal and local laws, codes, ordinances, and regulations, which, in any manner, affect those engaged or employed in the work, or the material or equipment, used in or upon the site, or in any way affect the conduct of the work. No misunderstanding or ignorance on the part of the Bidder will, in any way, serve to modify the provision of the contract.

4.4. LICENSE TO CONDUCT BUSINESS ON GUAM; POLICY OF LOCAL PROCUREMENT

Bidders providing supplies or services pursuant to this IFB are subject to licensure requirements in accordance with 5 GCA § 5008. Inquiries about obtaining a Guam business license should be directed to the Guam Department of Revenue and Taxation.

Preferential selection of a bidder licensed to do business on Guam and that maintains an office or other facility on Guam for an award pursuant to this IFB may be made in accordance with 5 GCA §5008. GDOE Procurement Form 005 must be completed and included with the Bid.

4.5. DISCLOSURE OF OWNERSHIP AND COMMISSIONS

Bidders must expressly identify all major shareholders in accordance with 5 GCA § 5233. AG Procurement Form 002 (Rev. Nov. 17, 2005) must be completed and included with the Bid.

4.6. BIDDERS CERTIFY THAT PRICE OR OFFER WAS INDEPENDENTLY ARRIVED AT WITHOUT COLLUSION

Bidders must certify that the submitted price or offer was independently arrived at without collusion in accordance with 2 GAR Div. 4 § 3126(b). AG Procurement Form 003 (Jul. 12, 2010) must be completed and included with the Bid.

4.7. PROHIBITION AGAINST GRATUITIES AND KICKBACKS

Bidders must certify to the best of their knowledge that neither they, nor any of their officers, representatives, agents, subcontractors, or employees, have violated or are violating the prohibition against gratuities and kickbacks set forth in 5 GCA §5630.

Bidders must certify to the best of their knowledge that neither they, nor any of their officers, representatives, agents, subcontractors, or employees have offered, given or agreed to give, any government of Guam employee or former government employee, any payment, gift, kickback, gratuity or offer of employment in connection with the bidder's response to this IFB. 5 GCA § 5630(c); 2 GAR Div. 4 § 11107(3) and 11107(4)(e). AG Procurement Form 004 (Jul. 12, 2010) must be completed and included with

4.8. REPRESENTATION REGARDING ETHICAL STANDARDS

Bidders must affirm that it has not knowingly influenced and promises that it will not knowingly influence a government employee to breach any of the ethical standards set forth in 5 GCA Chapter 5 Article 11 (Ethics in Public Contracting) of the Guam Procurement Act and in Chapter 11 of the Guam Procurement Regulations. AG Procurement Form 005 (Jul. 12, 2010) must be completed and included with the Bid.

4.9. REPRESENTATION REGARDING CONTINGENT FEES

Bidders must affirm that it has not retained a person to solicit or secure a territorial contract upon an agreement or understanding for a commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee, except for retention of bona fide employees or bona fide established commercial selling agencies for the purpose of securing business, in accordance with 5 GCA § 5631. AG Procurement Form 007 (Jul. 12, 2010) must be completed and included with the Bid.

4.10. PROHIBITION AGAINST EMPLOYMENT OF SEX OFFENDERS

Any entity providing services pursuant to this IFB is prohibited from employing sex offenders to provide the goods or services procured through this IFB, in accordance with 5 GCA § 5253, which states:

§5253. Restriction Against Contractors Employing Convicted Sex Offenders from Working at Government of Guam Venues.

- (a) No person convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9 Guam Code Annotated, or an offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA in Guam, or an offense in any jurisdiction which includes, at a minimum, all of the elements of said offenses, or who is listed on the Sex Offender Registry, and who is employed by a business contracted to perform services for an agency or instrumentality of the government of Guam, shall work for his employer on the property of the government of Guam other than a public highway.
- (b) All contracts for services to agencies listed herein shall include the following provisions: (1) warranties that no person providing services on behalf of the contractor has been convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9 GCA or an offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA, or an offense in another Jurisdiction with, at a minimum, the same elements as such offenses, or who is listed on the Sex Offender Registry; and (2) that if any person providing services on behalf of the contractor is convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9 GCA or an offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA or an offense in another jurisdiction with, at a minimum, the same elements as such offenses, or who is listed on the Sex Offender Registry, that such person will be immediately removed from working at said agency and that the administrator of said agency be informed of such within twenty-four (24) hours of such conviction.
- (d) any contractor found in violation of §5253(b), after notice from the contracting authority of such violation, shall, within twentyfour (24) hours, take corrective action and shall report such action to the contracting authority. Failure to take corrective action within the stipulated period may result in the temporary suspension of the contract at the discretion of the contracting

4.11. WAGE AND BENEFIT DETERMINATION FOR SERVICES

4.12. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

Section 3.01 of the Executive Order 10935 dated March 7, 1965 requires the Bidder not to discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, creed, color or national origin. The Bidder will take affirmative action to ensure that employees are treated equally during employment without regard to their race, creed, color or national origin.

4.13. MANDATORY DISPUTES CLAUSE

In accordance with Guam procurement law, all controversies between the territory and the Contractor which arise under, or by virtue of, this contract and which are not resolved by mutual agreement, shall be decided by the GDOE procurement officer in writing, within 60 days after written request by the Contractor for a final decision concerning the controversy; provided however that if the procurement officer does not issue a written decision within 60 days after written request for a final decision, or within such longer period as may be agreed upon by the parties, then the Contractor may proceed as if an adverse decision had been received. The procurement officer shall immediately furnish a copy of the decision to the Contractor, by certified mail, return receipt requested, or by any other method that provides evidence of receipt. Any such decision shall be final and conclusive, unless fraudulent, or the Contractor brings an action seeking review of the decision before the Guam Office of Public Accountability. The Contractor shall comply with any decision of the procurement officer and proceed diligently with performance of this contract pending final resolution by the Office of Public Accountability or the Superior Court of Guam of any controversy arising under or by virtue of this contract, except where there has been a material breach of the contract by GDOE; provided, however, that in any

event the Contractor shall proceed diligently with the performance of the contract where GDOE has made a written determination that continuation of work under the contract is essential to public health and safety.

Any disputes for expenses incurred in reliance upon this Agreement shall be subject to the Government Claims Act found at Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, Chapter 6.

4.14. DISABLED VETS: POLICY IN FAVOR OF SERVICE-DISABLED VETERAN OWNED BUSINESS

Pursuant to 5 GCA §5012, a bidder may qualify as a service-disabled veteran owned business if the following conditions apply: (a) the business is licensed to do business on Guam; maintains its headquarters on Guam; and is at least fifty-one percent owned by a service-disabled veteran who served in active U.S. military service, was discharged or released under honorable conditions, and whose disability is certified as service connected by a DD214 form and disability award letter from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs; and (b) the service-disabled owner of the business has filed individual tax returns on Guam for a period of at least three consecutive years prior to bidding on this IFB.

Notice of Service-Disabled Veteran Owned Business must be submitted with the bid by checking the appropriate box on the bid form and including a DD214 form and disability award letter with the bid form. The GDOE Supply Management Administrator will issue written notice to all bidders if any bidder is determined to be a qualified service-disabled veteran owned business pursuant to 5 GCA §5012. If a bidder is determined to be qualified under §5012, the requirements of 5 GCA §5011 shall apply to an award pursuant to this IFB.

4.15. RIGHT OF GDOE TO CANCEL OR REJECT BIDS

GDOE reserves the right to cancel this IFB at any time when it is in the best interests of the Department, in accordance with 5 GCA §5225 and 2 GAR Div. 4 §3115(c).

GDOE reserves the right to reject any bid in whole or in part when it is in the best interests of the Department, in accordance with 2 GAR Div.4 §3115(e)(2).

GDOE may resolicit for bids when it is deemed to be in the best interest of GDOE.

1) COMPUTER EMPLOYEES: This wage determination does not apply to any individual employed in a bona fide executive, administrative, or professional capacity, as defined in 29 C.F.R. Part 541. (See 41 C.F.R. 6701(3)). Because most Computer Systems Analysts and Computer Programmers who are paid at least \$27.63 per hour (or at least \$684 per week if paid on a salary or fee basis) likely qualify as exempt computer professionals under 29 U.S.C. 213(a)(1) and 29 U.S.C. 213(a)(17), this wage determination may not include wage rates for all occupations within those job families. In such instances, a conformance will be necessary if there are nonexempt employees in these job families working on the contract.

Job titles vary widely and change quickly in the computer industry, and are not determinative of whether an employee is an exempt computer professional. To be exempt, computer employees who satisfy the compensation requirements must also have a primary duty that consists of:

- (4) A combination of the aforementioned duties, the performance of which requires the same level of skills. (29 C.F.R. 541.400).

Any computer employee who meets the applicable compensation requirements and the above duties test qualifies as an exempt computer professional under both section 13(a)(1) and section 13(a)(17) of the Fair Labor Standards Act. (Field Assistance Bulletin No. 2006-3 (Dec. 14, 2006)). Accordingly, this wage determination will not apply to any exempt computer employee regardless of which of these two exemptions is utilized.

2) AIR TRAFFIC CONTROLLERS AND WEATHER OBSERVERS - NIGHT PAY & SUNDAY PAY: If you work at night as part of a regular tour of duty, you will earn a night differential and receive an additional 10% of basic pay for any hours worked between 6pm and 6am. If you are a full-time employed (40 hours a week) and Sunday is part of your regularly scheduled workweek, you are paid at your rate of basic pay plus a Sunday

premium of 25% of your basic rate for each hour of Sunday work which is not overtime (i.e. occasional work on Sunday outside the normal tour of duty is considered overtime work).

** HAZARDOUS PAY DIFFERENTIAL **

An 8 percent differential is applicable to employees employed in a position that represents a high degree of hazard when working with or in close proximity to ordnance, explosives, and incendiary materials. This includes work such as screening, blending, dying, mixing, and pressing of sensitive ordnance, explosives, and pyrotechnic compositions such as lead azide, black powder and photoflash powder. All dry-house activities involving propellants or explosives. Demilitarization, modification, renovation, demolition, and maintenance operations on sensitive ordnance, explosives and incendiary materials. All operations involving re-grading and cleaning of artillery ranges.

A 4 percent differential is applicable to employees employed in a position that represents a low degree of hazard when working with, or in close proximity to ordnance, (or employees possibly adjacent to) explosives and incendiary materials which involves potential injury such as laceration of hands, face, or arms of the employee engaged in the operation, irritation of the skin, minor burns and the like; minimal damage to immediate or adjacent work area or equipment being used. All operations involving, unloading, storage, and hauling of ordnance, explosive, and incendiary ordnance material other than small arms ammunition. These differentials are only applicable to work that has been specifically designated by the agency for ordnance, explosives, and incendiary material differential pay.

** UNIFORM ALLOWANCE **

If employees are required to wear uniforms in the performance of this contract (either by the terms of the Government contract, by the employer, by the state or local law, etc.), the cost of furnishing such uniforms and maintaining (by laundering or dry cleaning) such uniforms is an expense that may not be borne by an employee where such cost reduces the hourly rate below that required by the wage determination. The process for preparing a conformance request is as follows:

- 3) The contracting officer reviews the proposed action and promptly submits a report of the action, together with the agency's recommendations and pertinent information including the position of the contractor and the employees, to the U.S. Department of Labor, Wage and Hour Division, for review (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(ii)).
- 4) Within 30 days of receipt, the Wage and Hour Division approves, modifies, or disapproves the action via transmittal to the agency contracting officer, or notifies the contracting officer that additional time will be required to process the request.
- 5) The contracting officer transmits the Wage and Hour Division's decision to the contractor.
- 6) Each affected employee shall be furnished by the contractor with a written copy of such determination or it shall be posted as a part of the wage determination (See $29 \ \text{CFR } 4.6(b)(2)(iii)$).

Information required by the Regulations must be submitted on SF-1444 or bond paper.

When preparing a conformance request, the ""Service Contract Act Directory of Occupations"" should be used to compare job definitions to ensure that duties requested are not performed by a classification already listed in the wage determination. <u>Subject: Second Letter of Protest and Demand for Cancellation of IFB 002-2025 Due to Procedural Irregularities and Unfair Treatment</u>

Dear Mr. Paul,

We are writing to formally escalate our protest against the issuance and proceedings related to IFB 002-2025, specifically requesting the cancellation of the bid. Procedural irregularities and timing conflicts have placed JJ Global in a significantly disadvantaged position, undermining fairness and transparency in the procurement process. These issues have resulted in multiple levels of unfair treatment, further compounding the concerns we raised in our initial protest.

PRIMARY GROUNDS FOR BID CANCELLATION

1. Procedural Irregularities and Timing Conflict

The issuance of GDOE's Letter of Termination of Services on January 6, 2025, with an effective date of January 7, 2025, coincided with the bid submission deadline for IFB 002-2025. This abrupt termination, occurring while JJ Global was already fulfilling its contractual obligations under IFB 007-2023, created a significant timing conflict and placed us at a substantial disadvantage in preparing a competitive bid.

As you may note, the issuance of a bid bond, a mandatory requirement for bid submission, typically takes 2-3 weeks to be processed by surety agencies. This timing overlap hindered our ability to secure the necessary financing and submit a timely and competitive bid.

This simultaneous termination of services and the bid deadline, while JJ Global was already performing our contractual duties, demonstrates a clear lack of adequate separation and spacing between these critical events orchestrated by GDOE. This situation violates fairness and transparency mandated under Guam Procurement Law. Moreover, proceeding with IFB 002-2025 under these circumstances risks operational disruption to critical services for schools, directly impacting GDOE's obligations to ensure uninterrupted maintenance.



2. Inappropriate Termination of Services

The Notice of Termination, issued on January 6, 2025, with an effective date of January 7, 2025, constitutes a clear violation of proper notification protocols. Given the exceptionally short notice period, GDOE failed to provide an adequate timeframe for terminating our existing contract. Moreover, the Notice of Termination does not clearly stipulate due cause for ending our services, further compounding the lack of clarity and fairness in this process. This abrupt action, coupled with the overlapping bid deadline, underscores multiple levels of unfair treatment, particularly considering that we had already begun fulfilling our contractual obligations in good faith on January 2, 2025. More critically, the unexpected termination severely compromised our cash flow and operational continuity.

The lack of an ample notice period violates procedural requirements, denying JJ Global the ability to adequately prepare for the termination or participate in subsequent solicitations without prejudice. Additionally, the termination of our services, without clear communication or justification, exacerbates the unfair treatment we have faced and underscores GDOE's procedural irregularity.

SUPPORTING GROUNDS FOR BID CANCELLATION

We addressed these issues in our initial Letter of Protest dated January 6, 2025, and we are reiterating them here for further emphasis and resolution:

1. Inclusion of Regions Under IFB 007-2023

The solicitation for IFB 002-2025 improperly includes regions currently serviced under our existing contract (IFB 007-2023). This action directly contradicts prior assurances from GDOE that these regions would not be re-solicited while under our contract, further contributing to multiple levels of unfair treatment.

2. Misleading Amendments

We were misled by the amendments agreed upon by Anthony Quinata, as discussed by Kit Casin (JJ Global AGM), to exclude nine schools under our care in the new solicitation (IFB 002-2025). However, upon the issuance of Amendment 2, no changes were reflected whatsoever. We trusted your office to make the appropriate amendments, yet to no avail. This oversight has placed JJ Global in a severely disadvantaged position, compromising our ability to compete fairly.

ACTIONS SOUGHT

To address these multiple levels of unfair treatment and restore compliance with procurement policies, we request the following immediate actions:



- 1. Cancel IFB 002-2025 to correct procedural flaws, ensure fairness, and suspend all proceedings related to the bid until these issues are fully resolved.
- 2. Provide clarification on the rationale for including regions currently under JJ Global's contract in the new solicitation.

DEADLINE FOR RESPONSE

We require a written response confirming your commitment to these actions no later than 5:00 PM on Friday, January 13, 2025. Failure to address this protest in a timely and transparent manner will leave us no choice but to escalate this issue further to the Office of Public Accountability (OPA) and pursue all available legal remedies.

JJ Global remains committed to ensuring uninterrupted grounds maintenance services for GDOE schools. However, we cannot allow procedural oversights and unfair practices to undermine our rights and the integrity of the procurement process. We respectfully urge GDOE to uphold its obligations under Guam Procurement Law and take immediate corrective actions.

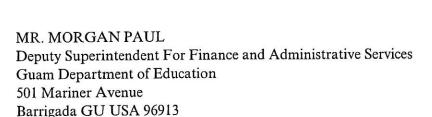

I am writing to follow up on our letter dated December 20, 2024, regarding the significant discrepancies and procedural concerns involving Invitation for Bid (IFB) 002-2025 and our prior contractual agreement for IFB 007-2023. To date, we have not received any response or acknowledgment from your office.

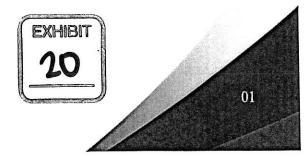
This continued silence is deeply concerning, given the gravity of the issues outlined in our original correspondence. The absence of formal notification regarding GDOE's decision not to exercise the first option year for IFB 007-2023 is a clear violation of both contractual obligations and Guam Procurement Law. Furthermore, your department's explicit direction for JJ Global to continue services under IFB 007-2023—combined with our adherence to these instructions—established a binding agreement for the second option year.

Additionally, the assurances provided by GDOE's Procurement Group that a Purchase Order (PO) would be issued and that the regions we currently service would not be resolicited further solidify our position. The subsequent release of IFB 002-2025, which includes regions under our current contract, not only breaches these assurances but also undermines our ability to provide uninterrupted services.

We reiterate our request for the following actions to be taken immediately:

- 1. Amend IFB 002-2025 to exclude the regions currently under our contract.
- 2. Issue a formal notice of amendment to IFB 007-2023 to accurately reflect any mutually agreed-upon changes.

Failure to address these discrepancies risks significant disruption to critical grounds maintenance services for GDOE schools and places an undue burden on our organization.





We require a written response confirming your commitment to resolving these issues by no later than 5:00 PM on Monday, December 30, 2024. Should we fail to receive a satisfactory response by this deadline, we will be compelled to initiate formal protest procedures and pursue all legal remedies available to us.

This is our final attempt to resolve this matter amicably. We strongly urge GDOE to uphold its commitments and ensure compliance with applicable laws and contractual terms.

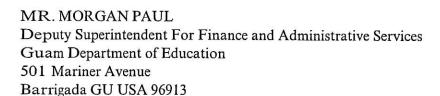

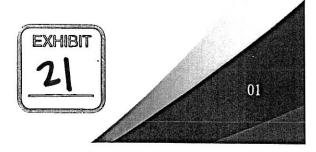


<u>Subject: Pre-protest Notice of Discrepancies and Request for Resolution Regarding IFB 002-2025 and Prior Contractual Agreements for IFB 007-2023.</u>

Dear Mr. Paul,

We would like to bring to your attention a serious discrepancy between the recently released Invitation for Bid IFB 002-2025 and prior agreements and communications regarding our existing grounds maintenance contract (IFB 007-2023), which has significant implications for our ongoing service provision.

- Potential Violation of Contractual Rights Due to Lack of Notice: Our letter of November 23, 2024 formally raised concerns regarding the complete absence of formal notification concerning GDOE's decision not to exercise the first option year of our contract (IFB 007-2023, originally a one base year plus two option years agreement). This lack of notification is a significant breach of contract and potentially a direct violation of the Guam Procurement Law. We have received no response to this communication to date.
- Instruction to Continue Services and Enrollment in Second Option Year: We received direct instruction from GDOE to continue providing services under IFB 007-2023 while awaiting issuance of a PO. This new direction, coupled with our continued performance of services, effectively constituted our enrollment in the second option year of the contract (IFB 007-2023); therefore, a legally binding agreement for the second option year was established.
- Binding Agreements with GDOE's Procurement Group: During a recent meeting with your Procurement Group, specific terms were agreed upon concerning our continued services under IFB 007-2023. These terms explicitly stated that a Purchase Order (PO) would be issued for the schools currently serviced by JJ Global, and that these same regions would be excluded from any subsequent re-solicitation. We firmly believe these agreements are binding, and any deviation constitutes a breach of contract.





Given the aforementioned points, the inclusion of our currently serviced school regions in the recently released solicitation (IFB 002-2025) directly contradicts prior agreements and creates a highly prejudicial situation. Furthermore, no formal notice of amendment to IFB 007-2023 has been executed to reflect any changes to our contractual agreement. We therefore formally request GDOE to immediately amend IFB 002-2025 to exclude the two regions currently under contract with JJ Global and execute a formal notice of amendment for IFB 007-2023 to reflect any agreed-upon changes. This action is essential to rectify this discrepancy and prevent disruption of vital services for GDOE students.

We are committed to maintaining a positive working relationship with GDOE and prefer to resolve this matter amicably. However, we must protect our contractual rights and the interests of our employees.

We request a written response confirming the withdrawal of the relevant portions of IFB 002-2025 by 5:00 PM on Monday, December 23, 2024 Failure to receive such confirmation will leave us no option but to pursue all available legal remedies.

We appreciate your prompt attention to this urgent matter.
